1 (4) Each year following the year in which [such] Federal census data is officially reported, a school director district 2 3 reapportionment commission shall be [constituted in like manner 4 and with like composition as the initial school director 5 district apportionment commission herein set forth.] appointed. Said reapportionment commission shall consist of seven members, 6 three to be appointed by the mayor of the most populous 7 municipality in the school district, three by the city council 8 9 of such municipality and one by the mayor of any other municipality of the school district with the approval of the 10 legislative body thereof. The duties of the reapportionment 11 12 commission shall be to determine, from the census data, whether 13 differences in the population of the existing school director districts require adjustment of the population in said 14 15 districts. In the event that adjustment of the population in said districts is required, the reapportionment commission 16 shall, to the extent necessary, move the lines that divide the 17 18 existing school director districts to make any new school director districts as compact, contiguous, as nearly equal in 19 20 population as practicable, and to best provide for racial 21 balance on the board of school directors of said school 22 district. In no event shall the number of school directors or 23 school director districts be increased or decreased. Such reapportionment commission shall file its plan no later than 24 25 forty-five days after either the commission has been duly 26 certified or the population data for the first class A school 27 district as determined by the Federal decennial census are 28 available, whichever is later in time.

ballot to be submitted to the voters of each first class A 1 school district under the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, 2 3 No.320), known as the "Pennsylvania Election Code," the 4 following question: 5 Shall the apportionment plan submitted by the school director district apportionment 6 Yes commission for the election of members of 7 8 the Board of Public Education of the school No 9 district of.....be approved? In the event the voters accept the apportionment plan, the 10 number of school director districts contained in the original 11 apportionment plan shall be the permanent number of school 12 13 director districts in said school district, and said permanent number of school director districts shall neither be increased 14 15 nor decreased by any future reapportionment commission nor by 16 the court of common pleas of the county in which the school district is located. 17 18 In the event the voters shall reject the apportionment plan, the nomination of school directors under this section shall be void 19 20 and the present board shall continue, but a second referendum, 21 upon the petition of fifteen per cent of the registered voters 22 of the school district, may be held after two years from the 23 date of the first election. * * * 24

25 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

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
