# HOUSE BILL No. 1170 Session of 1983

#### INTRODUCED BY SHOWERS, BALDWIN, RUDY AND COY, JUNE 8, 1983

## REFERRED TO COMMITTEE ON BUSINESS AND COMMERCE, JUNE 8, 1983

## AN ACT

1 2 3	Establishing a governmental agency to conduct a Statewide program for stimulating economic activity and developing potential for economic growth within the Commonwealth.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Short title.
7	This act shall be known and may be cited as the State
8	Planning and Development Act.
9	Section 2. Declaration of purpose.
10	The purpose of this act is to establish a Commonwealth agency
11	to conduct a Statewide program for stimulating economic activity
12	and developing potential for economic growth within the
13	Commonwealth. To this end, the objectives of this agency shall
14	be to:
15	(1) Maintain a well-balanced and managed economic
16	development and growth program for the Commonwealth. Both the
17	needs and the resources of the State vary drastically from
18	one region to another and even from one community to another.

1 The State's development strategy, therefore, must take into 2 account these distinctions. The development program for small 3 towns and rural areas and that for the State's larger 4 communities and metropolitan areas must be different. Thus, 5 the board's policy and involvement will vary depending upon 6 the area of the Commonwealth.

7 (2) Conserve, restore and develop natural, physical,
8 human, social, economic and productive resources of the
9 Commonwealth.

10 (3) Coordinate functions and activities of various 11 agencies within the Commonwealth and act as the official 12 liaison office between State, Federal and local planning, 13 research and development agencies.

14 (4) Promote and coordinate State and local activities in15 planning public works projects.

16 (5) Promote the public interest in the development of
17 the State through cooperation with public agencies, private
18 enterprises and charitable and social institutions.

19 (6) Promote and encourage industrial development,
20 private business and commercial enterprise, agricultural
21 production, transportation and the utilization and investment
22 of capital within the Commonwealth.

(7) Assist the development of State, interstate and
foreign trade, along with commerce and markets for
Pennsylvania goods by removing barriers to industrial,
commercial and agricultural development.

(8) Assist in insuring stability in employment and
increase the opportunities for employment of Pennsylvania
citizens and to devise means to raise the living standards of
the people of this Commonwealth.

(9) Advance the general welfare of the people.
 2 Section 3. Definitions.

3 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall 4 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 5 context clearly indicates otherwise:

"Agency." Any State officer, department, board, commission,
committee, institution, bureau, division, person or functional
group that is authorized to exercise or does exercise any
executive or administrative function of government in the State.

10 "Board." The State Development Board.

11 "Director." The Director of the State Development Board.

12 "Federal agency." Any agency of the Government of the United13 States.

14 "Local agency." Local political subdivisions of the State.15 "State." The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

16 Section 4. State Development Board; appointment of members and 17 officers; terms and vacancies.

18 The State Development Board shall be governed by a board 19 consisting of 15 members appointed by the Governor with the 20 advice and consent of two-thirds of the members of the Senate who are residents of the Commonwealth at the time of their 21 22 appointment and qualification, and have been qualified electors 23 for a period of at least one year preceding their appointment. Six members of the board shall be appointed from the State at 24 25 large. One of the members appointed from the State at large 26 shall be designated by the Governor to serve as chairman of the 27 board. The remaining nine members shall be designated as county 28 representatives and one member shall be appointed from each of the nine classes of counties. The members of the board appointed 29 30 by the Governor shall continue in office for a term of one to 19830H1170B1358 - 3 -

five years. Three members shall be appointed to each term, 1 respectively, from the date of their appointment until their 2 3 respective successors shall be duly appointed and qualified. The 4 term for each appointed member shall be designated by the 5 Governor at the time of their appointment. Successors shall be appointed for a term of five years, except that any person 6 7 appointed to fill a vacancy shall serve only for the unexpired term. Any appointed member of the board shall be eligible for 8 9 reappointment.

Section 5. Qualification; compensation of members of the board. No member of the board shall hold any public office or employment. Members of the board shall be compensated for their services at the regular per diem rate established by the General Assembly for other State boards and shall be reimbursed for actual and necessary expenses incurred in connection with their work as members of the board.

17 Section 6. Meetings of board; procedure and records.

All regular meetings of the board shall be public. The board shall adopt its own rules of procedure and keep adequate records of its proceedings. The director shall act as secretary of the board but shall have no vote.

22 Section 7. Director of development.

The board shall appoint a director to serve at the discretion of the board. The director shall be responsible to the board for the operation of the program outlined by the board and, subject to the approval of the board, shall have the authority to select, direct, control and remove all members of his staff and other personnel required for the operation of the board.

29 Section 8. Divisions; division chiefs.

30 The board shall consist of divisions for research, planning, 19830H1170B1358 - 4 - development or any other divisions as the board may establish by
 resolution. Each division shall be governed by a chief of the
 division selected on the basis of their technical and
 administrative qualifications and experience to perform the
 duties required by their position.
 Section 9. Duties and powers of the board.

7 The board shall have power and its duty shall be to:

8 (1) Advise and make recommendations to the Governor and 9 the General Assembly on all matters concerning its 10 objectives.

(2) Cooperate with other agencies of the Commonwealth in the development of plans to insure the correlation of such plans into a master plan designed to consider the natural, physical, social and economic needs of the Commonwealth.

15 (3) Have access to records and studies of each agency16 pertaining to the objectives of the board.

17 (4) Conduct studies on its own initiative pertaining to
18 any of its objectives and others at the request of the
19 Governor, the General Assembly or State or local agencies.

20 (5) Study area problems, establish local agencies and
21 furnish staff or financial aid as may be deemed advisable.

(6) Stimulate and encourage all local, State and Federal
governmental agencies with similar and related objectives and
purposes and to cooperate with local, regional and Federal
planning and development programs.

26 (7) Publish and distribute its findings, through written
27 reports, brochures, magazines, newspapers, television, radio,
28 periodicals and other recognized forms of advertising,
29 personal interviews, exhibits and displays in order that
30 governmental agencies, corporations and individual citizens

may become acquainted with the planning and development
 programs.

3 (8) Advertise the advantages of industrial, agricultural4 and commercial development by means of paid publicity.

5 (9) Provide information to and make contact with private 6 business enterprises and local, State and Federal 7 governmental agencies by any form of communication for the 8 purpose of dispensing information regarding industrial, 9 commercial and agricultural opportunities in the Commonwealth 10 and for the purpose of encouraging the establishment of new 11 or the expansion of existing industries and enterprises.

12 (10) Provide advice, upon request, by local, State and 13 Federal agencies, and by the private citizens and business 14 and commercial enterprises upon matters of economic 15 development, industrial and business expansion and 16 agricultural activity upon which its knowledge, sources of 17 information and findings and decisions of the board qualify 18 it to speak.

19 Section 10. Transfer of duties.

The powers and duties of the Department of Commerce are hereby transferred to the State Development Board which shall have the authority to:

(1) Investigate, study and undertake means of promoting
and encouraging economic development and protecting the
legitimate interests and welfare of Pennsylvania business,
industry and commerce within and without the Commonwealth.

(2) Investigate, study and undertake means of expanding
 markets and promoting and developing new markets for
 Pennsylvania products.

30 (3) Promote and encourage the location and development 19830H1170B1358 - 6 - of new business, industries and commerce within the
 Commonwealth.

3 (4) Investigate and study conditions affecting
4 Pennsylvania business, industry and commerce, to collect and
5 disseminate information and engage in technical studies,
6 scientific investigations, statistical research and
7 educational activities.

8 (5) Cooperate with and assist persons, firms,
9 associations, corporations, cooperative associations,
10 organizations and political subdivisions of the Commonwealth.

11 (6) Make recommendations to the General Assembly, for 12 improvement and elimination of restrictions and burdens which 13 adversely affect or retard the development or expansion of 14 business, industry or commerce.

(7) Initiate, promote, conduct or cause to be conducted, research designed to further new and more extensive uses and consumption of resources and their by-products; and to enter into contracts and agreements with research laboratories maintained by educational or endowed institutions in this Commonwealth and to expand appropriations made to the board for such purposes.

(8) Investigate and study conditions of unemployment, by
 recommending specific remedies for the alleviation of such
 conditions and aid in restoring employment in affected
 communities.

26 (9) Eliminate unfair competition and trade practices
27 tending to impair stability which are harmful to the
28 financial soundness of business, industry, commerce, wages
29 and working conditions.

30 (10) Encourage and develop commerce with other states 19830H1170B1358 - 7 - and foreign countries, by removing trade barriers hampering
 the free flow of commerce.

3 (11) Cooperate with interstate commissions engaged in
4 formulating and promoting the adoption of interstate compacts
5 and agreements helpful to business, industry and commerce.
6 Section 11. Advisory councils.

7 At the discretion of the board an advisory council or councils may be appointed to advise with respect to each board 8 function which may be the responsibility of the board. Each 9 advisory council shall consist of a group of not more than nine 10 members, consisting of State and local officials and private 11 individuals of outstanding ability in a particular field of 12 13 enterprise. The members shall receive no salary or per diem but may be compensated for actual expenses incurred in the 14 performance of their duties. The members shall serve for a term 15 established by resolution of the board and may be removed by the 16 board. Governmental officials shall serve on councils for a 17 18 period of one year and may be reappointed for successive terms 19 by the board. Terms of governmental officials shall end with the termination of their office. 20

21 Section 12. Confidential information.

22 Confidential information submitted to any agency as required 23 by law shall not be published in any manner which will directly 24 or indirectly discredit or damage the reputation of business 25 activity of any individual or corporation.

26 Section 13. Effective date.

27 This act shall take effect in 90 days.
