AN ACT

1	Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled
2	"An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the
3	executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the
4	Executive Department thereof and the administrative
5	departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof,
6	including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or
7	Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or
8	authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative
9	departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and
10	duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative
11	officers, and of the several administrative departments,
12	boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the
13	Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive
14	and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of
15 16	certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and

22	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
23	hereby enacts as follows:
24	Section 1. The act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known
25	as The Administrative Code of 1929, is amended by adding a
26	section to read:

1	<u>Section 224. Employe OrganizationsNothing in this act</u>
2	shall be construed to prohibit an employe organization from
3	establishing a voluntary Political Action Fund. To this end, the
4	employe organization may make use of payroll deductions so long
5	as individual employes give prior written authorization for the
6	deduction and provisions are made allowing the employe to
7	terminate his deduction schedule upon 30 days notice. The
8	employe organization shall reimburse the public employer for the
9	cost of such deductions.

10 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
