## AN ACT

- Amending the act of December 8, 1982 (P.L.848, No.235), entitled 2 "An act providing for the adoption of capital projects related to the repair, rehabilitation or replacement of 3 highway bridges to be financed from current revenue or by the 5 incurring of debt and capital projects related to highway and 6 safety improvement projects to be financed from current 7 revenue of the Motor License Fund, " adding a State bridge 8 project in Montgomery County and Luzerne County and local bridge projects in Bucks County. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

- 11 hereby enacts as follows:
- Section 1. Section 2 of the act of December 8, 1982 12
- 13 (P.L.848, No.235), known as the Highway-Railroad and Highway
- 14 Bridge Capital Budget Act for 1982-1983, is amended to read:
- 15 Section 2. Total authorization for bridge projects.
- 16 (a) The total authorization for the costs of the projects
- itemized pursuant to section 3 and to be financed from current 17
- revenue or by the incurring of debt shall be [\$979,196,000] 18
- \$980,578,000. 19
- 20 The authorization for capital projects in the category
- 21 of Highway Projects to be constructed by the Department of

- 1 Transportation, its successors or assigns, and to be financed by
- 2 the incurring of debt or from the Highway-Railroad and Highway
- 3 Bridge Improvement Restricted Account within the Motor License
- 4 Fund, itemized in section 3 under the category of State bridges,
- 5 is [\$747,800,000] <u>\$748,670,000</u>.
- 6 (c) The authorization for non-state highway bridge projects
- 7 to be constructed by local government municipalities and to be
- 8 financed in part with grants not exceeding 80% of the non-
- 9 federal share of the costs made to the local government
- 10 municipalities by the Department of Transportation from revenues
- 11 deposited on the Highway Bridge Improvement restricted account
- 12 within the Motor License Fund, itemized in section 3 under the
- 13 category of local bridges is [\$231,396,000] <u>231,868,300</u>.
- 14 Section 2. Section 3(9)(i), (39)(ii) and (45)(ii) of the act
- 15 are amended by adding projects to read:
- 16 Section 3. Itemization of bridge projects.
- 17 The individual capital projects in the category of highway
- 18 projects to be constructed by the Department of Transportation,
- 19 its successors or assigns, and to be financed from current
- 20 revenue or by the incurring of debt are hereby itemized,

- 12 Section 3. Sections 7 and 10 of the act are amended to read:
- 13 Section 7. Debt authorization.
- 14 The Governor, Auditor General and State Treasurer are hereby
- 15 authorized and directed to borrow, from time to time, in
- 16 addition to any authorization heretofore or hereafter enacted,
- 17 on the credit of the Commonwealth, subject to the limitations
- 18 provided in the current capital budget, money not exceeding in
- 19 the aggregate the sum of [\$747,800,000] \$748,670,000 as may be
- 20 found necessary to carry out the acquisition and construction of
- 21 the highway projects, specifically itemized in section 3 of this
- 22 capital budget.
- 23 Section 10. Appropriation.
- 24 The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations herein
- 25 authorized are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities
- 26 Fund to the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation in the
- 27 maximum amount of [\$747,800,000] <u>\$748,670,000</u> to be used by it
- 28 exclusively to defray the financial costs of the projects
- 29 specifically itemized in section 3 of this capital budget. After
- 30 reserving or paying the expenses of the sale of the obligation,

- 1 the State Treasurer shall pay out to the Pennsylvania Department
- 2 of Transportation the moneys as required and certified by it to
- 3 be legally due and payable.
- Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately. 4
