A RESOLUTION

- 1 Urging the Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission to proceed with the
- design and engineering work necessary to widen a portion of
- 3 the turnpike located between the Northeastern Extension and
- 4 the Philadelphia Interchange.
- 5 WHEREAS, The traffic on the Pennsylvania Turnpike from the
- 6 Valley Forge Interchange to the Philadelphia Interchange has
- 7 grown steadily over the past 20 years and has exceeded all
- 8 previous growth forecasts; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The widening of this portion of the turnpike to six
- 10 lanes was authorized by the General Assembly by Act 1978-331,
- 11 amending Act 1959-322, to be financed through the sale of bonds
- 12 by the commission; and
- WHEREAS, The design and engineering portions of said widening
- 14 project will require a significant length of time to complete;
- 15 and
- 16 WHEREAS, The Economic Development Council of Northeast
- 17 Pennsylvania adopted a resolution on December 16, 1982,
- 18 expressing support and cooperation for the proposed construction

- 1 of a turnpike interchange at Keyser Valley and recommending the
- 2 expeditious completion thereof; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation's
- 4 representative to the Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission has at
- 5 each of the past three meetings introduced a resolution to use
- 6 reserve revenues so that engineering design could begin
- 7 immediately, since engineering design is in fact the critical
- 8 activity determining when construction work can begin; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Rather than proceeding, the other Turnpike
- 10 Commission members have decided to hold up the project unless
- 11 they can seek premature bond financing for a project that will
- 12 not be ready to break ground for another year; and
- 13 WHEREAS, The Turnpike Commission currently lacks the
- 14 borrowing capacity to authorize a bond issue now in any event,
- 15 and that the commission will not be in a position to enter the
- 16 bond market until January or February 1984; and
- 17 WHEREAS, The project would create critically needed jobs; and
- 18 WHEREAS, The State's economy would be stimulated and
- 19 unemployment reduced by the project; therefore be it
- 20 RESOLVED, That the commission conduct the required
- 21 engineering feasibility study of alternate access at or near the
- 22 Scranton Interchange; and be it further
- 23 RESOLVED, That the General Assembly urge the Pennsylvania
- 24 Turnpike Commission to authorize the appropriate commission
- 25 personnel, contractors and consultants to undertake the design
- 26 and engineering work necessary for the widening of the turnpike
- 27 from four to six lanes from the junction of the Northeastern
- 28 Extension of the Philadelphia Interchange as authorized by Act
- 29 1978-331, amending Act 1959-322, and more completely described
- 30 in the commission's Amended Capital Improvement Program, Volume

- 1 II, dated January 1978, and to further authorize the undertaking
- 2 of the necessary traffic flow analyses to allow the coordination
- 3 of the design of the proposed widening with the proposed
- 4 interchanges of the Pennsylvania Turnpike with Interstate 476
- 5 and Interstate 95.
