6	By increasing the limits for deer, elk, bear, beaver, skunk,
7	muskrat, weasel, groundhog and squirrel or by some other method
8	providing for a reduction in the population of these animals,
9	the Game Commission could assist the farmers in reducing the
10	crop damage; and
11	While undertaking this program, the commission should also
12	develop a better program for removing carcasses from our
13	highways; therefore be it
14	RESOLVED, That the General Assembly urge the Pennsylvania
15	Game Commission to reduce the population of our wildlife herds
16	so they can coexist with farming operations and to develop a
17	better program for removing carcasses from our highways; and be
