20	This chapter shall be known and may be cited as the Game Fund

23	(a) Subject to the limitations set forth in subsection (b),	

the total authorization for the capital projects in the category
 of public improvement projects to be acquired by the
 Pennsylvania Game Commission and to be financed from current
 revenues of the Game Fund pursuant to executive authorizations
 shall be \$4,603,420.

6 (b) Notwithstanding the total authorization in subsection 7 (a), the total executive authorizations for fiscal year 1983-8 1984 for the capital projects itemized in section 103 shall not 9 exceed \$3,000,000, which sum contains the amount of \$801,710, 10 which is one-third of the purchase price for the Sullivan County 11 tract, the remaining two-thirds of the price to be paid in 12 fiscal years 1984-1985 and 1985-1986.

3 Section 205. Debt authorizations.

4 The Governor, Auditor General and State Treasurer are hereby 5 authorized and directed to borrow, from time to time, in addition to any authorization heretofore or hereafter enacted, 6 on the credit of the Commonwealth, subject to the limitations 7 8 provided in the act of , entitled "An act providing for the capital budget for fiscal year 1983-1984," money not 9 10 exceeding in the aggregate the sum of \$103,562,800 \$68,688,000 11 as may be found necessary to carry out the acquisition and construction of the projects specifically itemized in a Capital 12 13 Budget.

14 Section 206. Issue of bonds.

The indebtedness herein authorized shall be incurred from 15 16 time to time and shall be evidenced by one or more series of 17 general obligation bonds of the Commonwealth in such aggregate 18 principal amount for each series as the Governor, Auditor 19 General and State Treasurer shall determine, but the latest 20 stated maturity date shall not exceed the estimated useful life 21 of the project being financed as stated in section 207. 22 Section 207. Estimated useful life of project. 23 The General Assembly states that the estimated useful life of the projects heretofore itemized is as follows: 24

25 (1) Rolling Stock, 15 years.

26 (2) Passenger Buses, 12 years.

27 (3) Furniture and Equipment, 10 years.

28 (4) All others, 30 years.

29 Section 208. Appropriation.

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authorized are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities 1 2 Fund to the Department of Transportation in the maximum amount 3 of \$103,562,800 \$68,688,000 to be used by it exclusively to 4 defray the financial cost of the projects specifically itemized 5 in a Capital Budget. After reserving or paying the expenses of 6 the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the 7 Department of Transportation the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable. 8

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9 Section 209. Allocation of funds.

Whenever as determined by the Department of Transportation that the full estimated financial costs of the capital projects itemized in sections 203 and 204 are not necessary for the proper design, acquisition or construction of the projects, the excess funds no longer required may be allocated to increase the estimated cost of any one or more of the capital projects specifically itemized in a Capital Budget.

17 Section 210. Legislative intent.

18 It is the intent of the General Assembly that the 19 authorizations provided in section 203 represent the full State 20 share of 16 2/3% of the total project costs.

14 SECTION 308. APPROPRIATION.

15 THE NET PROCEEDS OF THE SALE OF THE OBLIGATIONS HEREIN AUTHORIZED ARE HEREBY APPROPRIATED FROM THE CAPITAL FACILITIES 17 FUND TO THE PENNSYLVANIA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION IN THE 18 MAXIMUM AMOUNT OF \$35,942,500 TO BE USED BY IT EXCLUSIVELY TO 19 DEFRAY THE FINANCIAL COSTS OF THE PROJECTS SPECIFICALLY ITEMIZED 20 IN SECTION 303 OF THIS CAPITAL BUDGET.
