5	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6	hereby enacts as follows:
7	Section 1. Section 432.5(c) of the act of June 13, 1967
8	(P.L.31, No.21), known as the Public Welfare Code, added July
9	15, 1976 (P.L.993, No.202) and amended April 8, 1982 (P.L.231,
10	No.75), is amended to read:
11	Section 432.5. Limits on Property Holdings* * *
12	(c) Other [property in excess of two hundred fifty dollars
13	(\$250) for a single person assistance unit and other] property
14	in excess of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for a single person
15	assistance unit or for assistance units with more than one
16	person shall be considered an available resource. The following
17	items shall not be considered an available resource, unless such
18	consideration is required under Federal law or regulations:

(1) Wedding and engagement rings, family heirlooms, clothing
 and children's toys.

3 (2) Household furnishings, personal effects and other items
4 used to provide, equip, and maintain a household for the
5 applicant and recipient.

6 (3) Equipment and material which are necessary to implement
7 employment, rehabilitation, or self care plan for the applicant
8 or recipient.

9 (4) A motor vehicle with an equity value that does not 10 exceed limits as the department may establish by regulation.

11 (5) Retroactive assistance payments received as a result of 12 a prehearing conference or a fair hearing decision.
