AN ACT

1 Designating Lincoln University a land grant institution.

2 An Act of Congress, passed August 30, 1890, known as the
3 Second Morrill Act (26 Stat. 419, 7 U.S.C. § 321 et seq.),
4 provided for the further endowment and support of colleges of
5 agriculture and mechanical arts.

6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania has
7 recognized and is now aiding Lincoln University as an integral
8 part of a system of higher education in Pennsylvania, under the
9 act of July 7, 1972 (P.L.743, No.176), known as the Lincoln
10 University-Commonwealth Act, pursuant to the requirements of the
11 Second Morrill Act for designation as an 1890 land grant
12 institution.

13 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
14 hereby enacts as follows:

15 Section 1. Designation as land grant institution.

16 Lincoln University is hereby designated an 1890 land grant
17 institution eligible to receive endowments and support as

1 provided in the act of August 30, 1890, known as the Second
2 Morrill Act (26 Stat. 419, 7 U.S.C. § 321 et seq.).

3 Section 2. Recipient of funds.

4 Lincoln University shall be the recipient of such Federal
5 funds allocated to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania as are
6 authorized by the Congress of the United States solely and
7 exclusively for the support of the land grant activities of
8 colleges and universities eligible to receive funds under the
9 Second Morrill Act (26 Stat. 419, 7 U.S.C. § 321 et seq);
10 sections 1444 and 1445 of the National Agricultural Research,
11 Extension, and Teaching Policy Act of 1977 (Public Law 95-113, 7
12 U.S.C. §§ 3221 and 3222); section 1432(b) of the Agriculture and
13 Food Act of 1981 (Public Law 97-98, 95 Stat. 1311); section 1533
14 of the Agriculture and Food Act of 1981 (Public Law 97-98, 16
15 U.S.C. § 3456); and any subsequent Federal legislation which
16 authorizes appropriations solely and exclusively for such
17 colleges and universities eligible under the Second Morrill Act.
18 Section 3. Pennsylvania State University.

19 The Pennsylvania State University, as the 1862 land grant
20 institution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, under the act
21 of July 1, 1862, known as the Morrill Act (12 Stat. 503, 7
22 U.S.C. § 301 et seq.), shall be the recipient of all Federal
23 funds allocated to or for the use of an 1862 land grant
24 institution in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, except as
25 provided in section 2.

26 Section 4. No duplication or competition.

27 Lincoln University may receive funds pursuant to the Second
28 Morrill Act (26 Stat. 419, 7 U.S.C. § 321 et seq.) to provide
29 land grant educational, research or extension programs, services
30 or activities which are not in substantial duplication of or in

1 substantial competition with the land grant educational,
2 research or extension programs, services and activities of the
3 Pennsylvania State University.

4 Section 5. Transmittal.

5 A copy of this act shall be transmitted to the Secretary of
6 the United States Department of Education.

7 Section 6. Effective date.

8 This act shall take effect immediately.
