8	Section 1. Section 1236 of act of July 28, 1953 (P.L.723,

11	Section 1236. Coroner's Investigations[The coroner having
12	a view of the body shall investigate the facts and circumstances
13	concerning deaths which appear to have happened within the
14	county, regardless where the cause thereof may have occurred] <u>In</u>
15	all cases where an individual sustains injuries in one county
16	and is transported for medical treatment to a medical facility
17	in another county where he dies or is pronounced dead, the
18	coroner of the county where the injuries were sustained shall
19	view the body and investigate the facts and circumstances

concerning the death, for the purpose of determining whether or 1 not an inquest thereof should be had, in the following cases: 2 3 (1) Any sudden, as hereafter defined, violent or suspicious 4 death, (2) any death wherein no cause of death is properly certified by a person duly authorized thereof, (3) any death 5 resulting from a mine accident, as directed by law, (4) deaths 6 resulting from drownings, cave-ins and subsidences, (5) any 7 8 stillbirth, or the death of any baby dying within twenty-four hours after its birth, and, in addition thereto, (6) the death 9 of any prematurely born infant, wherein the cause of death is 10 11 not properly certified by a person duly authorized thereto. 12 The purpose of the investigation shall be to determine 13 whether or not there is any reason sufficient to the coroner to believe that any such death may have resulted from the criminal 14 15 acts or criminal neglect of persons other than the deceased, rather than from natural causes or by suicide. 16

17 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
