Thereafter, council may sell such property, in whole 4 or in part, for the best price or prices obtainable. If council shall estimate the sale value to be two hundred dollars or more, 5 the entire lot shall be advertised for sale once in at least one 6 newspaper, in accordance with the provisions of section one 7 hundred nine of this act, and sale of the property so advertised 8 shall be made to the best responsible bidder; and the bids shall 9 10 not be opened until at least ten days after the said 11 advertisement. Council may sell any such property at auction, but the provisions as to notice contained in this section shall 12 13 be likewise observed as to the holding of such auction sales. The provisions of this section shall not be mandatory where city 14 15 personal property is to be traded-in or exchanged for new city 16 personal property. The provisions of this section requiring advertising for bids shall not apply where city personal 17 18 property is to be sold to a political subdivision, school district, municipal authority, housing authority, redevelopment 19 20 authority, parking authority, industrial development authority, nonprofit corporation engaged in economic or industrial 21 development, or a public library. 22

23 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
