- Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- Statutes, further providing for the periods when vehicles must have lighted lamps. 2

- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- Section 1. Section 4302 of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania 6
- Consolidated Statutes is amended to read: 7
- § 4302. Period for requiring lighted lamps. 8
- 9 [Every vehicle upon a highway at any time between sunset and
- 10 sunrise and at any other time when, due to insufficient light or
- unfavorable atmospheric conditions, persons and vehicles on the 11
- 12 highway are not clearly discernible from a distance of 1000 feet
- ahead shall display lighted head and other lamps and 13
- 14 illuminating devices as required under this chapter for
- 15 different classes of vehicles, subject to exceptions with
- respect to parked vehicles. Stop lights, turn signals and other 16
- signaling devices shall be lighted as prescribed in this title.] 17
- (a) General rule. -- Subject to exceptions for parked 18

- 1 vehicles, every vehicle operated upon a highway shall display
- 2 <u>lighted lamps and illuminating devices required under this</u>
- 3 chapter for different classes of vehicles between sunset and
- 4 sunrise and under the following conditions:
- 5 (1) When rain, snow, fog, insufficient light or
- 6 <u>unfavorable atmospheric conditions reduce visibility to the</u>
- 7 <u>extent that persons or vehicles 1000 feet ahead of the</u>
- 8 <u>vehicle are not clearly discernible.</u>
- 9 (2) When the vehicle's windshield wipers are in
- 10 operation.
- 11 (b) Stop lights, turn signals and other devices.--Stop
- 12 lights, turn signals and other signaling devices shall be
- 13 <u>lighted as prescribed in this title.</u>
- 14 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
