A RESOLUTION

Directing the Speaker of the House of Representatives to appoint 1 2 a special select committee HEALTH AND WELFARE COMMITTEE to investigate all aspects of recent regulations adopted by the 3 State Department of Public Welfare in relation to the 4 5 reimbursement for both public and private nursing homes. б WHEREAS, Since October of 1978, there have been at least six 7 regulatory changes which have acted to link medical assistance 8 reimbursement for net operating costs to nursing homes; and WHEREAS, On January 8, 1983, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 9 10 changed the definition of skilled nursing care ostensibly to 11 comply with Federal regulations, and as a result, numerous 12 patients of nursing homes throughout the State were decertified 13 for the skilled nursing level of care and certified for the lower intermediate level of care; and 14 WHEREAS, As the result of this regulation, patients continued 15 to receive the same medical services that they had received 16

prior to decertification, but with less reimbursement to nursing
homes per patient per day; and

3 WHEREAS, The Department of Public Welfare has made less than 4 adequate adjustments for patient care in medicaid reimbursements 5 since October 1978, when the current cost-related reimbursement 6 system was implemented; and

7 WHEREAS, The Department of Public Welfare recently decided to 8 use the median per diem of net operating costs as a statistical 9 measure for determining the reimbursement ceilings, which 10 results in one-half of the facilities receiving full 11 reimbursement for their allowable costs while the other one-half

12 does not, irrespective of whether any or all of these facilities 13 are operating economically and efficiently; and

14 WHEREAS, Prior to 1982, the Department of Public Welfare used 15 a weighted average to calculate the ceiling, which, according to 16 various interpretations, was a fair and more reasonable 17 methodology of establishing a reimbursement ceiling; and 18 WHEREAS, In 1977 the Department of Public Welfare promulgated limitations on reimbursement for depreciation and interest for 19 20 building and equipment expenses at \$22,000 per bed; and 21 WHEREAS, These ceilings on capital-related expenditures that 22 were enacted in 1977, using 1976 data, have never been revised despite the fact that inflation has risen significantly; and 23 24 WHEREAS, The capital-related ceilings have penalized various 25 public and private nursing homes that built modern long term 26 care facilities at the time when construction costs and interest 27 rates were very high; and

28 WHEREAS, Reimbursement may no longer be sufficient to sustain 29 normal operating costs that would assure the delivery of 30 adequate and necessary care; therefore be it 19850H0113R1666 - 2 -

1 RESOLVED, That the Speaker of the House of Representatives <-2 appoint a select committee, five members to be from the majority 3 party and four members to be from the minority party, to HEALTH <-----4 AND WELFARE COMMITTEE investigate all of the above-mentioned 5 Department of Public Welfare regulations affecting nursing homes, as well as any other applicable regulations or actions by 6 the State, to determine if legislative action should be taken to 7 adopt legislation to repeal these regulations; and be it further 8 9 RESOLVED, That the committee may hold hearings, take 10 testimony and make its investigations at such places as it deems 11 necessary in this Commonwealth. Each member of the committee shall have power to administer oaths and affirmations to 12 13 witnesses appearing before the committee; and be it further 14 RESOLVED, That the committee is authorized to hire such staff <-----15 and assistants as it deems necessary, and the fees and expenses 16 incurred by the committee shall be paid from accounts under the 17 control of the Chief Clerk, in an amount not to exceed \$50,000; 18 and be it further 19 RESOLVED, That the committee shall make a preliminary report

20 of its findings to the House of Representatives by November 30, 21 1985, and shall make a final report by February 1, 1986.
