AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 4 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," providing for special aid to school districts suffering loss of tax revenue due to reorganization 6 or bankruptcy of businesses in the district. 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known 10 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a 11 12 section to read: Section 2502.16. Special Aid to School Districts Suffering 13 14 Loss of Tax Revenue Due to Reorganization or Bankruptcy of 15 Businesses in District. -- (a) For the school year 1985-1986 and 16 each school year thereafter, a school district experiencing a 17 ten percent (10%) or greater loss in revenue from real estate

taxes for the support of the public schools in any one (1)

school year or reasonably projecting a loss, AS DETERMINED BY

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- 1 THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION, TAKING INTO ACCOUNT PRIOR REAL
- 2 ESTATE TAX COLLECTION RATES, of such percent of revenue
- 3 <u>following the nonpayment of such taxes when due, by reason of</u>
- 4 <u>reorganization or other bankruptcy proceedings UNDER CHAPTER 7,</u>
- 5 11 OR 13 OF THE BANKRUPTCY CODE (11 U.S.C. § 101 ET SEQ.) by one
- 6 or more businesses owning real estate within the boundaries of
- 7 the public school district, shall qualify for special aid under
- 8 this section.
- 9 (b) Such special aid shall be equal to the amount of lost
- 10 revenue caused by the bankruptcy proceedings and shall be
- 11 payable to the school district during the school year in
- 12 <u>question</u>. The special aid shall be paid from undistributed basic
- 13 instruction subsidy funds to the extent that such funds are
- 14 available.
- 15 (c) Such special aid shall be payable until such time as the

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- 16 <u>business reorganization or other bankruptcy proceedings are</u>
- 17 <u>completed: Provided, however, That a school district which</u>
- 18 qualified for such special aid prior to the effective date of
- 19 this section shall receive its first payment in the year this
- 20 <u>section takes effect.</u>
- 21 (d) Any subsequent payments made on account of such ceased
- 22 or suspended real estate taxes by such business or businesses or
- 23 bankruptcy officials, either during the course of such
- 24 <u>bankruptcy proceedings or following their completion, shall be</u>
- 25 <u>reimbursed to the Department of Education by the school district</u>
- 26 to the extent that such previously unpaid taxes have been
- 27 supplanted by special aid already provided under this section.
- 28 Any interest or penalties accompanying such belatedly paid taxes
- 29 shall be retained by the school district to the extent that the
- 30 special aid previously paid to the school district did not

- 1 include such interest and penalties.
- 2 (e) The special aid owing hereunder shall be due whenever
- 3 the real estate taxes of such business or businesses in
- 4 <u>bankruptcy</u> are unpaid as of their due date and the business or
- businesses in question will not certify, in writing, that such 5
- unpaid taxes will definitely be paid within sixty (60) days 6
- after their due date, and there is in fact uncertainty as to the 7
- payment of such taxes, whether such uncertainty is due to
- bankruptcy proceeding restrictions., lack of funds or other
- 10 reasons.
- 11 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
