AN ACT

- Amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), entitled "An 2 act relating to alcoholic liquors, alcohol and malt and 3 brewed beverages; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto; regulating and 5 restricting the manufacture, purchase, sale, possession, consumption, importation, transportation, furnishing, holding in bond, holding in storage, traffic in and use of alcoholic 7 liquors, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages and the 8 9 persons engaged or employed therein; defining the powers and 10 duties of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board; providing for the establishment and operation of State liquor stores, 11 for the payment of certain license fees to the respective 12 municipalities and townships, for the abatement of certain 13 14 nuisances and, in certain cases, for search and seizure without warrant; prescribing penalties and forfeitures; 15 providing for local option, and repealing existing laws," 16 17 authorizing the sale of wine in kegs. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

- 20 Section 1. The act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), known
- 21 as the Liquor Code, is amended by adding a section to read:
- Section 412. Wine in Kegs. -- Wine in kegs or containers of 22
- 23 eight liters or less may be sold or purchased by the board.
- 24 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
