## AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of July 28, 1953 (P.L.723, No.230), entitled, 2 as amended, "An act relating to counties of the second class
- as amended, "An act relating to counties of the second class 3 and second class A; amending, revising, consolidating and
- 4 changing the laws relating thereto, providing for an
- 5 additional member on the retirement board.
- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 7 hereby enacts as follows:
- 8 Section 1. Section 1703 of the act of July 28, 1953
- 9 (P.L.723, No.230), known as the Second Class County Code, is
- 10 amended to read:
- 11 Section 1703. Retirement Board. -- The retirement system shall
- 12 be under the sole direction of a board, which shall consist of
- 13 the county commissioners, the treasurer, the controller, [and]
- 14 two persons elected by ballot from among the members of the
- 15 retirement system, one to serve for two years and one for four
- 16 years, and one person elected by ballot from among former county
- 17 employes currently receiving retirement allowances, to serve for
- 18 four years. Following the completion of the initial terms, the
- 19 stated terms of such members shall be four years. Ballots shall

- 1 be mailed to each member of the retirement system, or to each
- 2 <u>former county employe currently receiving a retirement</u>
- 3 <u>allowance</u>, <u>respectively</u>, at least twenty (20) days prior to the
- 4 date of the election. A vacancy occurring during the term of any
- 5 member of the board shall be filled for the unexpired term by
- 6 the appointment or election of a successor in the same manner as
- 7 his predecessor. A majority of the members of the board shall
- 8 constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business.
- 9 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
