15	II. Fines for Violation of Ordinances. To prescribe fines

violation of township ordinances, which fines and penalties may be collected by suit brought in the name of the township before any justice of the peace, in like manner as debts of like amount may be sued for by existing laws, and to remit such fines and penalties.
