AN ACT

Amending the act of April 27, 1927 (P.L.450, No.291), entitled, as amended, "An act relating to fires and fire prevention; 3 imposing duties and conferring powers upon the Pennsylvania State Police; authorizing the appointment of the chiefs of 5 fire departments and certain public officers and others as 6 assistants to the Pennsylvania State Police, and defining their powers and duties; providing for the investigation of the cause, origin, and circumstance of fires and the 7 8 9 inspection of all, and the removal or change of, certain buildings by owners and occupants thereof, including 10 political subdivisions; imposing duties on school authorities 11 and on certain corporations, associations, and fire rating 12 13 agencies; providing for the attendance of witnesses before 14 the Pennsylvania State Police, and the enforcement of its orders; and prescribing penalties, "further providing for 15 unsalaried assistants to the Pennsylvania State Police. 16 17 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 18 19 Section 1. Section 9 of the act of April 27, 1927 (P.L.450, No.291), referred to as the State Fire Marshal Law, amended 20 21 April 28, 1943 (P.L.123, No.63), is amended to read: 22 Section 9. The assistants to the Pennsylvania State Police, 23 not receiving a salary for the performance of public duties, shall receive, upon the audit of the Pennsylvania State Police, 24

[fifty cents] five dollars (\$5.00) for each report of each

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- 1 separate fire reported to the Pennsylvania State Police under
- 2 this act, and, in addition thereto, shall be paid the sum of
- 3 [fifteen cents] <u>twenty-two cents</u> for each mile traveled to the
- 4 place of fire and, in the discretion of the Pennsylvania State
- 5 Police, where an investigation has been made, a sum not to
- 6 exceed [three dollars (\$3.00)] six dollars and sixty cents
- 7 (\$6.60) for each day's service spent in such investigation.
- 8 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
