23 APPROPRIATION OF FEDERAL FUNDS TO THE EXECUTIVE AND JUDICIAL

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6 SECTION 1101. EFFECTIVE DATE.

7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8 hereby enacts as follows:

1 ~~Utilities. Every electric light company, waterpower company and~~
2 ~~hydro electric company now or hereafter incorporated or~~
3 ~~organized by or under any law of this Commonwealth, or now or~~
4 ~~hereafter organized or incorporated by any other state or by the~~
5 ~~United States or any foreign government and doing business in~~
6 ~~this Commonwealth, and every limited partnership, association,~~
7 ~~joint stock association, copartnership, person or persons,~~
8 ~~engaged in electric light and power business, waterpower~~

3 EMPLOYEE GROUP LIFE INSURANCE AND EMPLOYEE AND RETIRED EMPLOYEE
4 GROUP HOSPITAL AND MEDICAL INSURANCE, PAYMENT OF COMMONWEALTH
5 SHARE OF SOCIAL SECURITY TAXES AND UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION
6 COSTS FOR STATE EMPLOYEES, THE PURCHASE OF REPLACEMENT OR
7 ADDITIONAL EQUIPMENT AND MACHINERY AND ALL OTHER INCIDENTAL

12 THROUGH THE PURCHASING FUND. THE TERM "EXPENSES" ALSO SHALL
13 INCLUDE THE MEDICAL COSTS FOR THE TREATMENT OF INMATES OF STATE
14 INSTITUTIONS WHEN THE INMATE MUST BE TRANSFERRED TO AN OUTSIDE
15 HOSPITAL: PROVIDED, THAT IN NO CASE SHALL THE STATE INSTITUTION

12 PENNSYLVANIA STATE POLICE FOR LIQUOR CONTROL ENFORCEMENT
13 OPERATIONAL EXPENSES AND FOR THE PAYMENT OF ANY OTHER EXPENSES,
14 AS PROVIDED BY LAW OR BY THIS ACT, NECESSARY FOR THE PROPER
15 CONDUCT OF THE DUTIES, FUNCTIONS AND ACTIVITIES AND FOR THE
16 PURPOSES HEREINAFTER SET FORTH FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING
17 JULY 1, 1988, AND FOR THE PAYMENT OF BILLS INCURRED AND
18 REMAINING UNPAID AT THE CLOSE OF THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30,
19 1988.

20 SECTION 105. FEDERAL AUGMENTATION APPROPRIATIONS.--THE
21 FOLLOWING FEDERAL AUGMENTATION APPROPRIATIONS SET FORTH IN THIS
22 ACT, OR AS MUCH THEREOF AS MAY BE NECESSARY, ARE HEREBY
23 SPECIFICALLY APPROPRIATED FROM THE FEDERAL AUGMENTATION FUNDS TO
24 THE SEVERAL HEREINAFTER NAMED AGENCIES OF THE EXECUTIVE AND
25 JUDICIAL DEPARTMENTS OF THE COMMONWEALTH FOR THE PAYMENT OF THE
26 EXPENSES OF IMPLEMENTING AND CARRYING OUT THE PROGRAMS STATED
27 HEREIN FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 1988, AND FOR THE
28 PAYMENT OF BILLS INCURRED AND REMAINING UNPAID AT THE CLOSE OF
29 THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 1988. UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED,
30 THE APPROPRIATIONS INCLUDE ANY CARRYOVERS FROM THE PRIOR FISCAL

2 SECTION 106. JOB TRAINING PARTNERSHIP ACT APPROPRIATIONS.--
3 THE FOLLOWING SUMS AS SET FORTH IN THIS ACT, OR AS MUCH THEREOF
4 AS MAY BE NECESSARY, ARE HEREBY APPROPRIATED FROM THE JOB
5 TRAINING PARTNERSHIP ACT (JTPA) FUNDS TO THE SEVERAL HEREINAFTER
6 NAMED AGENCIES OF THE EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT OF THE COMMONWEALTH
7 FOR THE PAYMENT OF THE EXPENSES OF IMPLEMENTING AND CARRYING OUT
8 THE PROGRAM STATED HEREIN FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1,
9 1988.

10 SECTION 107. BLOCK GRANTS.--(A) APPROPRIATION.--THE
11 FOLLOWING SUMS SET FORTH IN THIS ACT, OR AS MUCH THEREOF AS MAY
12 BE NECESSARY, ARE HEREBY SPECIFICALLY APPROPRIATED FROM THE
13 BLOCK GRANT (BG) FUNDS TO THE SEVERAL HEREINAFTER NAMED AGENCIES
14 OF THE EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT OF THE COMMONWEALTH FOR THE
15 PURPOSES, AND UNDER THE RESTRICTIONS, FOR WHICH THE FUNDS ARE
16 PROVIDED FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 1988.

17 (B) SMALL COMMUNITIES DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT.--THE SMALL
18 COMMUNITIES DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (SCDBG) IS TO ASSIST SMALL

(3) "RECEIPTS FROM FEDERAL GOVERNMENT - CIVIL DEFENSE - DISASTER RELIEF ASSISTANCE TO STATE AND POLITICAL SUBDIVISION" - FOR ASSISTANCE TO STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENTS AND TO SELECTED PRIVATE NONPROFIT FACILITIES IN ALLEVIATING EMERGENCIES ARISING FROM MAJOR DISASTERS.

SECTION 808. PENNSYLVANIA HISTORICAL AND MUSEUM COMMISSION.--THE FOLLOWING RESTRICTED RECEIPT ACCOUNTS MAY BE
