#### INTRODUCED BY KENNEDY, SEPTEMBER 30, 1987

## REFERRED TO COMMITTEE ON STATE GOVERNMENT, SEPTEMBER 30, 1987

## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11 12	Amending the act of September 30, 1983 (P.L.160, No.39), entitled "An act establishing salaries and compensation of certain public officials including justices and judges of Statewide courts, judges of courts of common pleas, judges of the Philadelphia Municipal Court, judges of the Philadelphia Traffic Court, district justices and the Governor, the Lieutenant Governor, the State Treasurer, the Auditor General, the Attorney General and certain other State officers and the salary and certain expenses of the members of the General Assembly; and repealing certain inconsistent acts," further providing for the salaries and compensation of certain public officials; and making repeals.
13	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
14	hereby enacts as follows:
15	Section 1. Sections 2, $3(a)$ and $(b)$ and 4 of the act of
16	September 30, 1983 (P.L.160, No.39), known as the Public
17	Official Compensation Law, amended July 3, 1987 (P.L.193,
18	No.28), are amended to read:
19	Section 2. Judiciary.
20	(a) Supreme CourtThe annual salary of the Chief Justice
21	of the Supreme Court shall be [\$94,000] <u>\$79,000</u> and the annual
22	salary of each of the other justices of the Supreme Court shall

1 be [\$91,500] <u>\$76,500</u>.

2 (b) Superior Court.--The annual salary of the President
3 Judge of the Superior Court shall be [\$91,000] <u>\$76,000</u> and the
4 annual salary of the other judges of the Superior Court shall be
5 [\$89,500] <u>\$74,500</u>.

6 (c) Commonwealth Court.--The annual salary of the President
7 Judge of the Commonwealth Court shall be [\$91,000] <u>\$76,000</u>. The
8 annual salary of each of the other judges of the Commonwealth
9 Court shall be [\$89,500] <u>\$74,500</u>.

10 (d) Courts of common pleas.--

11 (1) The annual salary of a president judge of a court of 12 common pleas shall be fixed in accordance with the following 13 schedule:

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(i) Allegheny County, [\$82,000] <u>\$67,000</u>.

15 (ii) Philadelphia, [\$82,500] <u>\$67,500</u>.

16 (iii) Judicial districts having six or more judges,
17 [\$81,000] <u>\$66,000</u>.

18 (iv) Judicial districts having three to five judges,
19 [\$80,500] <u>\$65,500</u>.

20 (v) Judicial districts having one or two judges,
 21 [\$80,000] <u>\$65,000</u>.

(vi) Administrative judges of the divisions of the
Court of Common Pleas of Philadelphia County; divisions
of six or more judges, [\$81,000] <u>\$66,000</u>.

(vii) Administrative judges of the divisions of the
Court of Common Pleas of Philadelphia County with
divisions of five or less judges, [\$80,500] <u>\$65,500</u>.

(viii) Administrative judge of divisions of the
Court of Common Pleas of Allegheny County with divisions
of six or more judges, [\$81,000] <u>\$66,000</u>.

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(ix) Administrative judge of divisions of the Court
 of Common Pleas of Allegheny County of five or less
 judges, [\$80,500] <u>\$65,500</u>.

4 (2) The other judges of the courts of common pleas shall
5 be paid an annual salary of [\$80,000] <u>\$65,000</u>.

6 [(e.1) Philadelphia Municipal Court.--The President Judge of
7 the Philadelphia Municipal Court shall receive an annual salary
8 of \$79,500. The annual salary for the other judges of the
9 Philadelphia Municipal Court shall be \$78,000.

10 (f.1) Philadelphia Traffic Court.--The President Judge of 11 the Philadelphia Traffic Court shall receive an annual salary of 12 \$40,000. The annual salary for the other judges of the 13 Philadelphia Traffic Court shall be \$39,500.

14 (g.1) District justices.--A district justice shall receive 15 an annual salary payable by the Commonwealth and computed by 16 adding to \$26,500 the product of the population of his 17 magisterial district times \$1, but in no event shall the salary 18 exceed \$38,000.]

19 (h) Senior judges. -- The compensation of the senior judges 20 pursuant to 42 Pa.C.S. § 4121 (relating to assignment of judges) shall be [\$250] <u>\$200</u> per day. In any calendar year the amount of 21 22 compensation which a senior judge shall be permitted to earn as 23 a senior judge shall not, when added to retirement income paid by the Commonwealth for such senior judge, exceed the 24 25 compensation payable by the Commonwealth to a judge then in 26 regular active service on the court from which said senior judge 27 retired. A senior judge who so elects may serve without being paid all or any portion of the compensation provided by this 28 section. 29

30 Section 3. Compensation of Governor and Lieutenant Governor; 19870H1762B2193 - 3 - 1

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State Treasurer; Auditor General; Attorney General; and heads of departments.

3 (a) The Governor, the Lieutenant Governor and Cabinet. -- The 4 annual salaries of the Governor, the Lieutenant Governor and the 5 heads of the departments shall be as follows: Governor, [\$105,000] <u>\$85,000</u>; Lieutenant Governor, [\$83,000] <u>\$67,500</u>; 6 Adjutant General, [\$72,000] <u>\$58,000</u>; Secretary of Aging, 7 8 [\$76,000] <u>\$61,500;</u> Secretary of Agriculture, [\$72,000] <u>\$58,000;</u> Secretary of Banking, [\$72,000] <u>\$58,000</u>; Secretary of Commerce, 9 10 [\$76,000] <u>\$61,500;</u> Secretary of the Commonwealth, [\$72,000] 11 <u>\$58,000;</u> Secretary of Community Affairs, [\$72,000] <u>\$58,000;</u> Secretary of Education, [\$80,000] <u>\$65,000</u>; Secretary of 12 13 Environmental Resources, [\$80,000] <u>\$65,000</u>; Secretary of General 14 Services, [\$76,000] <u>\$61,500</u>; Secretary of Health, [\$80,000] 15 <u>\$65,000</u>; Insurance Commissioner, [\$72,000] <u>\$58,000</u>; Secretary of 16 Labor and Industry, [\$80,000] \$65,000; Secretary of Public 17 Welfare, [\$80,000] <u>\$65,000</u>; Secretary of Revenue, [\$76,000] 18 <u>\$61,500</u>; State Police Commissioner, [\$76,000] <u>\$61,500</u>; Secretary 19 of Transportation, [\$80,000] <u>\$65,000</u>.

(b) Compensation of State Treasurer, Auditor General and
Attorney General.--The annual salaries of the State Treasurer,
Auditor General and Attorney General shall be as follows: State
Treasurer, [\$84,000] <u>\$58,000</u>; Auditor General, [\$84,000]
<u>\$58,000</u>; Attorney General, [\$84,000] <u>\$65,000</u>.

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26 Section 4. Members of the General Assembly.

(a) Members salary, expense and mileage.--The salary of members of the General Assembly shall be [\$47,000] <u>\$35,000</u> per annum and mileage to and from their homes at the rate of 20ç per mile, circular, for each week a member was in actual attendance 19870H1762B2193 - 4 -

in session between their homes and the State Capitol and, except 1 2 as provided herein, no other compensation shall be allowed 3 whatsoever, except each member of the General Assembly shall 4 receive an allowance for clerical assistance and other expenses 5 incurred during his term in connection with the duties of his office in the sum of \$7,500 annually; the salary to be payable 6 7 in equal monthly installments the first day of the month, 8 including the installment due December 1 of each even-numbered year except that the salaries of Senators elected at the General 9 10 Election of 1986 during the remainder of their term shall be 11 \$35,000 per annum and such members shall receive, in addition to the allowance for clerical assistance and other expenses, the 12 13 [unvouchered] expense allowance of [\$12,000] <u>\$10,000</u> per annum. (b) Officers and leaders salaries.--14

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(1) Senate.--

16 The following officers of the Senate who shall (i) 17 be elected by the Senate or their respective caucuses 18 shall, in addition to their salaries as members of the 19 General Assembly, receive the following as additional 20 compensation: President pro tempore, [\$26,370] <u>\$19,600;</u> 21 Majority Leader, [\$21,097] <u>\$15,680</u>; Minority Leader, 22 [\$21,097] <u>\$15,680</u>; Majority Whip, [\$16,011] <u>\$11,900</u>; 23 Minority Whip, [\$16,011] <u>\$11,900</u>; Majority Caucus 24 Chairman, [\$9,983] <u>\$7,420;</u> Minority Caucus Chairman, 25 [\$9,983] <u>\$7,420;</u> Appropriations Chairman, [\$16,011] 26 <u>\$7,420;</u> Minority Appropriations Chairman, [\$16,011] 27 \$7,420; Majority Caucus Secretary, [\$6,593] \$4,900; 28 Minority Caucus Secretary, [\$6,593] <u>\$4,900</u>; Minority Policy Chairman, [\$6,593] <u>\$4,900</u>. 29

30 (ii) The following officers of the Senate who shall 19870H1762B2193 - 5 - be appointed by the President pro tempore shall, in
 addition to their salaries as members of the General
 Assembly, receive the following amounts as additional
 compensation: Majority Policy Chairman, [\$6,593] <u>\$4,900</u>;
 Majority Caucus Administrator, [\$6,593] <u>\$4,900</u>.

6 (iii) The following officer of the Senate who shall 7 be appointed by the Minority Leader shall, in addition to 8 his salary as a member of the General Assembly, receive 9 the following amount as compensation: Minority Caucus 10 Administrator, [\$6,593] <u>\$4,900</u>.

11 House of Representatives.--The following officers of (2) 12 the House of Representatives who shall be elected by the 13 House or their respective caucuses, in addition to their salary as members of the General Assembly, shall receive the 14 15 following amounts as additional compensation: Speaker of the 16 House of Representatives, [\$26,370] \$19,600; Majority Leader, 17 [\$21,097] <u>\$15,680</u>; Minority Leader, [\$21,097] <u>\$15,680</u>; 18 Majority Whip, [\$16,011] <u>\$11,900</u>; Minority Whip, [\$16,011] <u>11,900</u>; Majority Caucus Chairman, [\$9,983]\$7,420; Minority 19 20 Caucus Chairman, [\$9,983] <u>\$7,420</u>; Appropriations Chairman, 21 [\$16,011] \$7,420; Minority Appropriations Chairman, [\$16,011] 22 <u>\$7,420</u>; Majority Caucus Secretary, [\$6,593] <u>\$4,900</u>; Minority 23 Caucus Secretary, [\$6,593] <u>\$4,900</u>; Majority Policy Chairman, 24 [\$6,593] <u>\$4,900</u>; Minority Policy Chairman, [\$6,593] <u>\$4,900</u>; 25 Majority Caucus Administrator, [\$6,593] <u>\$4,900</u>; Minority 26 Caucus Administrator, [\$6,593] <u>\$4,900</u>. 27 Section 2.
