AN ACT

Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the 2 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for punitive 3 damages. 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 5 hereby enacts as follows: 6 Section 1. Title 42 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 7 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read: 8 § 7104. Punitive damages. 9 (a) General rule. -- Punitive damages may be awarded over and 10 above compensatory damages only where there is a showing, by clear and convincing evidence, that the tort-feasor's conduct 11 was outrageous because: 12 (1) the tort-feasor acted with an evil motive; or 13 14 (2) the tort-feasor knew or had reason to know of facts 15 creating a high degree of risk of physical harm to another 16 person and acted or failed to act in conscious disregard of or indifference to the risk. 17

(b) Gross negligence. -- A showing of gross negligence is

- insufficient to support an award of punitive damages.
- 2 (c) Contracts. -- Punitive damages shall not be awarded in an
- 3 action based on a breach of contract.
- 4 (d) Maximum. -- Punitive damages shall not exceed 200% of the
- 5 compensatory damages awarded.
- Section 2. This act shall apply to actions which have been 6
- commenced after the effective date of this act. 7
- 8 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
