A RESOLUTION

1 Memorializing the Congress of the United States to amend Federal
2 unemployment compensation law so that employers are not
3 required to pay more in automatic penalties on the
4 Commonwealth's outstanding loan balance than is owed on the
5 debt principal.

6 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania employers and the Commonwealth are
7 currently repaying the debt owed to the Federal Government for
8 loans of unemployment compensation moneys; and

9 WHEREAS, Current Federal law provides for certain automatic
10 penalty provisions which would cause Pennsylvania employers to
11 pay more in automatic penalties on the Commonwealth's
12 outstanding loan balance than is owed on the debt principal;
13 therefore be it

14 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the
15 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania memorialize the Congress of the
16 United States to enact legislation preventing Pennsylvania
17 employers from paying these automatic penalties; and be it
18 further

19 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to

- 1 the presiding officers of each house of Congress and to each
- 2 member of Congress from Pennsylvania.
