1 2 3	Establishing the Hardwoods DEVELOPMENT Council; conferring powers and duties upon the council; and making an appropriation.	<
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania	
5	hereby enacts as follows:	
6	Section 1. Short title.	
7	This act shall be known and may be cited as the Hardwoods	
8	DEVELOPMENT Council Act.	<
9	Section 2. Declaration of policy.	<
10	The General Assembly finds and declares as follows:	
11	(1) The hardwood forest industry is an important segment	
12	of the continuing economic revitalization of this	
13	Commonwealth.	
14	(2) Fifty five percent of the land in this Commonwealth	
15	is classified as commercial forest land. This represents	
16	approximately 16,000,000 acres of timber resources, which are	

- capable of providing essential raw materials for an
 economically sound and expanding forest industry.
- 4 of timber resources. This heritage, utilizing proper multiuse

(3) This Commonwealth is uniquely endowed with an excess

- 5 management by professional foresters and private interests,
- 6 will provide a vital source of raw materials and jobs for
- 7 present and future generations. However, the Commonwealth has
- 8 not made the most of this unique opportunity. Most of the
- 9 marketable hardwoods are being shipped out of this
- 10 Commonwealth and out of the country, where they will be
- 11 transformed into value added hardwood products, instead of
- 12 being processed in this Commonwealth.
- 13 (4) The Commonwealth, in an effort to promote economic
- development, should take the initiative by encouraging the
- 15 hardwood industry to further develop the secondary
- 16 manufacturing process of hardwood. This will make full use of
- 17 the valuable and renewable timber resource and create vital
- 18 jobs.

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- 19 (5) It is the policy of the Commonwealth to establish
- 20 the council for the purpose of expanding and promoting the
- 21 development and efficient usage of hardwood timber resources
- 22 located in this Commonwealth.
- 23 Section 3. Definitions.
- 24 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 25 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 26 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 27 "Council." The Hardwoods Council of the Commonwealth

- 2 (d) Vacancies. Vacancies in office shall be filled by the
- 3 appointing authority who made the original appointment.
- 4 (e) Officers. The council shall elect one of its members to
- 5 be chairperson and may elect other officers as it deems
- 6 necessary.
- 7 (f) Meetings. The council shall meet quarterly and shall
- 8 hold special meetings at the call of the chairperson. Eleven
- 9 members constitute a quorum.
- 10 (g) Expenses. Members of the council shall serve without
- 11 compensation. They shall be entitled to reimbursement for
- 12 necessary and reasonable expenses incurred in the performance of
- 13 their duties.
- 14 Section 5. Functions and objectives.
- 15 The council shall serve as the coordinating body to the
- 16 General Assembly and the administrative agencies of the
- 17 Commonwealth with regard to the development, expansion and
- 18 promotion of the hardwood industry in this Commonwealth. The
- 19 council shall seek to meet the following objectives:
- 20 (1) To expand the hardwood industrial job base in this
- 21 Commonwealth. This paragraph includes expansion of existing
- 22 hardwood jobs and recruitment of complementary new hardwood
- 23 manufacturing process companies. The objective stated in this
- 24 paragraph shall lead to retention, expansion and creation of
- 25 jobs. The objective stated in this paragraph shall utilize an
- 26 <u>increase in JOBS, AND THE FOSTERING OF capital investments in</u>
- 27 the hardwood industry in this Commonwealth.
- 28 (2) To promote better efficiencies of the existing
- 29 hardwood industries. This paragraph includes technology
- 30 transfer, applied research and investment in equipment and

technology necessary to enhance the hardwood industry.

(3) To promote basic research in wood characteristics and product potential, current wood product promotion, new product development and marketing and long range research and marketing strategies. This paragraph is comprehensive; it is aimed at all species and grades of woods, including those species that are underutilized.

- (4) To provide institutional support for the hardwood industry of this Commonwealth by insuring effective cooperation and communication among governmental agencies, the academic and research community and the hardwood industry. This paragraph includes international activity.
- (5) To establish information transfer through a common data base and knowledgeable personnel to further develop and enhance the hardwood industry.
- (6) To encourage long range hardwood development in ways
 which are sustainable and environmentally sound. This
 paragraph includes educational programs providing knowledge
 in the area of forest management and marketing methods and
 effective planning and development to preserve timber, a
 renewable resource, for multiuse in a diversified regional
 economy.
- 23 Section 6. Powers and duties of council.
- 24 The council has the following powers and duties:
- 25 (1) To undertake and implement appropriate measures
 26 relating to the promotion of the industrial potential of the
 27 hardwood industry in this Commonwealth.
- 28 (2) To create plans for economic development and
 29 expansion of the Commonwealth's hardwood industry.
- 30 (3) To recommend implementation procedures for plans to

5	(4) To encourage and stimulate cooperation and

23	expansion and promotion of the hardwood industry in this

25	(7) To maintain liaison with, and provide necessary and	
26	appropriate financial assistance to, regulatory and other	
27	groups and organizations involved with the hardwood industry.	
28	(8) To enter into contracts.	
29	(9) To appoint, fix compensation of and prescribe duties	

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of an executive director, a secretary and other personnel as

1	the council deems necessary to accomplish the purposes of	
2	this act.	
3	(10) To accept grants from public and private sources.	
4	(11) To promulgate regulations to administer this act.	
5	(12) To do things that it deems necessary, proper and

DECLARATION OF POLICY. <----17 THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS AND DECLARES AS FOLLOWS: 18 THE HARDWOOD FOREST INDUSTRY PLAYS A KEY ROLE IN THE CONTINUING ECONOMIC REVITALIZATION OF THIS COMMONWEALTH. 19 20 (2) FIFTY-FIVE PERCENT OF THE LAND IN THIS COMMONWEALTH IS CLASSIFIED AS COMMERCIAL FOREST LAND. THIS REPRESENTS 21 22 APPROXIMATELY 16,000,000 ACRES OF TIMBER RESOURCES, WHICH ARE 23 CAPABLE OF PROVIDING ESSENTIAL RAW MATERIALS FOR AN ECONOMICALLY SOUND AND EXPANDING FOREST INDUSTRY. 24 25 (3) THIS COMMONWEALTH IS UNIQUELY ENDOWED WITH AN 26 ABUNDANCE OF TIMBER RESOURCES. THIS HERITAGE, UTILIZING 27
 - (3) THIS COMMONWEALTH IS UNIQUELY ENDOWED WITH AN ABUNDANCE OF TIMBER RESOURCES. THIS HERITAGE, UTILIZING PROPER MULTIUSE MANAGEMENT BY PROFESSIONAL FORESTERS AND PRIVATE INTERESTS, WILL PROVIDE A VITAL SOURCE OF RAW MATERIALS AND JOBS FOR PRESENT AND FUTURE GENERATIONS. - 4 PRODUCTS, INSTEAD OF BEING PROCESSED IN THIS COMMONWEALTH.
- 5 (4) THE COMMONWEALTH, IN AN EFFORT TO PROMOTE ECONOMIC
- 6 DEVELOPMENT, SHOULD TAKE THE INITIATIVE BY ENCOURAGING THE
- 7 HARDWOOD INDUSTRY TO FURTHER DEVELOP THE SECONDARY
- 8 MANUFACTURING PROCESS OF HARDWOOD. THIS WILL MAKE FULL USE OF
- 9 THE VALUABLE AND RENEWABLE TIMBER RESOURCE AND CREATE VITAL
- 10 JOBS.

- 12 (3) TO PROMOTE BASIC AND LONG-TERM RESEARCH IN WOOD
- 13 CHARACTERISTICS AND NEW PRODUCT DEVELOPMENT. THIS SHALL
- 14 INCLUDE RESEARCH AIMED AT ALL SPECIES AND GRADES OF WOODS,
- 15 INCLUDING THOSE SPECIES THAT ARE UNDERUTILIZED.
- 16 (4) TO PROVIDE INSTITUTIONAL SUPPORT FOR THE HARDWOOD
- 17 INDUSTRY OF THIS COMMONWEALTH BY INSURING EFFECTIVE
- 18 COOPERATION AND COMMUNICATION AMONG GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES,
- 19 THE ACADEMIC AND RESEARCH COMMUNITY AND THE HARDWOOD
- 20 INDUSTRY. THIS CLAUSE INCLUDES INTERNATIONAL ACTIVITY.
- 21 (5) TO ESTABLISH INFORMATION TRANSFER THROUGH A COMMON
- 22 DATA BASE AND KNOWLEDGEABLE PERSONNEL TO FURTHER DEVELOP AND
- 23 ENHANCE THE HARDWOOD INDUSTRY.
- 24 (6) TO ENCOURAGE LONG-RANGE HARDWOOD DEVELOPMENT IN WAYS
- 25 WHICH ARE SUSTAINABLE AND ENVIRONMENTALLY SOUND. THIS CLAUSE
- 26 INCLUDES EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS PROVIDING KNOWLEDGE IN THE AREA
- 27 OF FOREST MANAGEMENT AND MARKETING METHODS AND EFFECTIVE
- 28 PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT TO PRESERVE TIMBER, A RENEWABLE
- 29 RESOURCE, FOR MULTIUSE IN A DIVERSIFIED REGIONAL ECONOMY.
- 30 SECTION 6. POWERS AND DUTIES OF COUNCIL.

- 1 THE COUNCIL HAS THE FOLLOWING POWERS AND DUTIES:
- 2 (1) TO RECOMMEND APPROPRIATE MEASURES RELATING TO THE
- 3 PROMOTION OF THE INDUSTRIAL POTENTIAL OF THE HARDWOOD
- 4 INDUSTRY IN THIS COMMONWEALTH.
- 5 (2) TO PROPOSE PLANS FOR ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND
- 6 EXPANSION OF THE COMMONWEALTH'S HARDWOOD INDUSTRY.
- 7 (3) TO DEVELOP A NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL MARKETING
- 8 PROGRAM TO PROMOTE PENNSYLVANIA HARDWOODS AS THE WORLD'S
- 9 FINEST AND TO ASSIST PENNSYLVANIA'S HARDWOOD MANUFACTURERS
- 10 AND PROCESSORS IN DEVELOPING NATIONAL AND FOREIGN MARKETS.
- 11 (4) TO ENCOURAGE COOPERATION AND COORDINATION AMONG
- 12 FEDERAL, STATE AND LOCAL PROGRAMS. THIS CLAUSE INCLUDES
- 13 PUBLIC-SECTOR AND PRIVATE-SECTOR PROGRAMS. THIS CLAUSE
- 14 INCLUDES ACCESS TO THE DATA OF ADMINISTRATIVE AGENCIES UNLESS
- 15 THE ACCESS IS PROHIBITED BY LAW.
- 16 (5) TO RECOMMEND TO THE GOVERNOR, THE SECRETARY OF
- 17 COMMERCE AND THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY THE UPDATING OF ECONOMIC
- 18 DELIVERY TOOLS AS WELL AS TO DEVELOP RESEARCH INITIATIVES
- 19 WHICH WOULD LEAD TO THE PROMOTION OF THE HARDWOOD INDUSTRY IN
- 20 THE COMMONWEALTH.
- 21 (6) TO MAINTAIN LIAISON WITH AND ADVISE THE GOVERNOR.
- 22 THE SECRETARY OF COMMERCE AND THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON
- 23 PROGRAMS AND PROJECTS, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO,
- 24 RESEARCH, MARKETING AND PROMOTION. THESE ACTIVITIES SHALL BE
- 25 CARRIED OUT IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE DEPARTMENT AND THE
- 26 APPROPRIATE NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS WHOSE PRIMARY ROLE IS TO
- 27 PROMOTE THE HARDWOOD INDUSTRY.
- 28 SECTION 7. COUNCIL STAFF AND SUPPORT PERSONNEL.
- THE DEPARTMENT SHALL DESIGNATE AN APPROPRIATE NUMBER OF
- 30 PEOPLE ON A FULL-TIME BASIS, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, A

- FULL-TIME EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TO SUPPORT THE COUNCIL'S
- 2 ACTIVITIES. THE STAFF SUPPORT IS CONDITIONAL UPON THE
- 3 AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS DESIGNATED TO THE COUNCIL BY THE GENERAL
- 4 ASSEMBLY.
- 5 SECTION 8. REPORTS.
- 6 THE COUNCIL SHALL MAKE A BIENNIAL WRITTEN REPORT TO THE
- GOVERNOR AND THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON THE STATUS OF THE HARDWOOD 7
- 8 INDUSTRY IN THIS COMMONWEALTH. THE FIRST REPORT IS DUE WITHIN
- ONE YEAR OF THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ARTICLE. THE REPORT SHALL
- 10 INCLUDE:
- 11 (1) THE EXTENT TO WHICH THE HARDWOOD INDUSTRY HAS
- 12 PROVIDED EMPLOYMENT AND INCOME FOR THE RESIDENTS OF THIS
- 13 COMMONWEALTH.
- 14 (2) THE ACTIONS TAKEN TO ENHANCE THE PERFORMANCE OF THE
- 15 HARDWOOD INDUSTRY.
- 16 (3) RECOMMENDATIONS FOR REVISIONS IN POLICIES, PROGRAMS
- 17 AND PROCEDURES AND FOR PROPOSED LEGISLATION THAT WILL ENHANCE
- 18 THE ECONOMIC PERFORMANCE OF THE HARDWOOD INDUSTRY IN THIS
- 19 COMMONWEALTH.
- 20 SECTION 9. EXPENDITURES.
- 21 THE HARDWOODS DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL IS GRANTED THE AUTHORITY TO
- 22 SPEND ANY SUM OF MONEYS APPROPRIATED TO CARRY OUT THE PROVISIONS
- 23 OF THIS ACT INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, RESEARCH, MARKETING,
- 24 FINANCIAL SUPPORT OF NONPROFIT REGIONAL ORGANIZATIONS AND
- 25 ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS.
- 26 SECTION 10. EFFECTIVE DATE.
- 27 THIS ACT SHALL TAKE EFFECT IMMEDIATELY.
