AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- Statutes, further providing for driving without a license.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Section 1501(d) of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania
- 6 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
- 7 § 1501. Drivers required to be licensed.
- 8 * * *
- 9 (d) Penalty. -- Any person violating subsection (c) commits a
- 10 summary offense and shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay
- 11 <u>a fine of \$200 for each license held beyond one valid license.</u>
- 12 Any person violating subsection (a) [is guilty of] commits a
- 13 summary offense and shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay
- 14 a fine of \$200, except that, if the person charged furnishes
- 15 satisfactory proof of having held a driver's license valid on
- 16 the last day of the preceding driver's license period and no
- 17 more than one year has elapsed from the last date for renewal,

- 1 the fine shall be \$25. No person charged with violating
- 2 subsection (a) or (b) shall be convicted if the person produces
- 3 at the office of the issuing authority within five days of the
- 4 violation:
- 5 (1) a driver's license valid in this Commonwealth at the
- 6 time of the violation; or
- 7 (2) if the driver's license is lost, stolen, destroyed
- 8 or illegible, evidence that the driver was licensed at the
- 9 time of the violation.
- 10 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
