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AN ACT

1 To provide additional appropriations from the General Fund for  
2 the expenses of the Executive Department and Judicial  
3 Department of the Commonwealth, the public debt and for the  
4 public schools for the fiscal year July 1, 1988, to June 30,  
5 1989, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining  
6 unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1988;  
7 to provide additional appropriations from the Motor License  
8 Fund to the Executive Department; to provide for the  
9 additional appropriation of Federal funds to the Executive  
10 Department of the Commonwealth for the fiscal year July 1,  
11 1988, to June 30, 1989, and for the payment of bills incurred  
12 and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending  
13 June 30, 1988.

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FOR 1988-1989

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11 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania  
12 hereby enacts as follows:

13 PART I

14 GENERAL PROVISIONS

15 Section 101. Short title.--This act shall be known and may  
16 be cited as the Second Supplemental Appropriation Act to the  
17 General Appropriation Act of 1988.

18 Section 102. Definitions.--The following words and phrases  
19 when used in this act shall have the meanings given to them in  
20 this section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

21 "Employees." Includes all directors, superintendents, bureau  
22 or division chiefs, assistant directors, assistant  
23 superintendents, assistant chiefs, experts, scientists,  
24 engineers, surveyors, draftsmen, accountants, secretaries,  
25 auditors, inspectors, examiners, analysts, statisticians,  
26 marshals, clerks, stenographers, bookkeepers, messengers and  
27 other assistants in any department, board or commission.

28 "Expenses" and "maintenance." Includes all printing, binding  
29 and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies,  
30 traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and

1 repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage, telephones and  
2 telegraph rentals and toll charges, newspaper advertising and  
3 notices, public advertising by or through any medium, fuel,  
4 light, heat, power and water, minor construction and renovation,  
5 repairs or reconstruction of equipment, buildings and  
6 facilities, rent of real estate and equipment, premiums on  
7 workmen's compensation, insurance premiums on policies of  
8 liability insurance, insurance premiums on medical payment  
9 insurance and surety bonds for volunteer workers, premiums on  
10 employee group life insurance and employee and retired employee  
11 group hospital and medical insurance, payment of Commonwealth  
12 share of Social Security taxes and unemployment compensation  
13 costs for State employees, the purchase of replacement or  
14 additional equipment and machinery and all other incidental  
15 costs and expenses, including payment to the Department of  
16 General Services of mileage and other charges for the use of  
17 automobiles and rental payments for permanently assigned  
18 automobiles and of expenses or costs of services incurred  
19 through the Purchasing Fund. The term "expenses" also shall  
20 include the medical costs for the treatment of inmates of State  
21 institutions when the inmate must be transferred to an outside  
22 hospital: Provided, That in no case shall the State institution  
23 pay more for patient care than that provided under the State  
24 medical assistance program.

8 Section 104. State appropriations.--(a) General Fund.--The  
9 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may  
10 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the  
11 General Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the  
12 Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the  
13 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other  
14 compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or  
15 appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for  
16 payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the  
17 purchase or rental of goods and services, printing, public  
18 advertising by or through any medium, equipment, land and  
19 buildings and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by  
20 law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the  
21 duties, functions and activities and for the purposes  
22 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,  
23 1988, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid  
24 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1988.

25 (b) Motor License Fund.--The following sums, or as much  
26 thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from the  
27 Motor License Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the  
28 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages and other  
29 compensation and travel expenses necessary for the proper  
30 conduct of the duties, functions and activities for the purposes

1 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,  
2 1988, and for the payment of bill incurred and remaining unpaid  
3 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1988.

4 Section 105. Federal augmentation appropriations.--The  
5 following Federal augmentation appropriations set forth in this  
6 act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby  
7 specifically appropriated from the Federal augmentation funds to  
8 the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive and  
9 Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of the  
10 expenses of implementing and carrying out the programs stated  
11 herein for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1988, and for the  
12 payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of  
13 the fiscal year ending June 30, 1988. Unless otherwise stated,  
14 the appropriations include any carryovers from the prior fiscal  
15 year.

16 Section 106. Job Training Partnership Act appropriations.--  
17 The following sums as set forth in this act, or as much thereof  
18 as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from the Job  
19 Training Partnership Act (JTPA) funds to the several hereinafter  
20 named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth  
21 for the payment of the expenses of implementing and carrying out  
22 the program stated herein for the fiscal year beginning July 1,  
23 1988.

24 Section 107. Block grants.--(a) Appropriation.--The  
25 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may  
26 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the  
27 block grant (BG) funds to the several hereinafter named agencies  
28 of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the  
29 purposes, and under the restrictions, for which the funds are  
30 provided for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1988.

1 (b) Small Communities Development Block Grant.--The Small  
2 Communities Development Block Grant (SCDBG) is to assist small  
3 cities and communities that have a high concentration of  
4 impoverished citizens and substandard housing to expand their  
5 low and moderate income housing opportunities and to meet  
6 community development needs.

7 (c) Community Services Block Grant.--The Community Services  
8 Block Grant (CSBG) is to provide a range of services and  
9 activities having a measurable and potentially major impact on  
10 the causes of poverty in the community or those areas of the  
11 community where poverty is a particularly acute problem. In  
12 addition, new focus may be placed on the unemployed, both old  
13 and new. Local agencies may lower their eligibility requirements  
14 for recipients to three months to allow greater flexibility to  
15 assure proper consideration of each recipient.

16 (d) Education Consolidation and Improvement Block Grant.--  
17 The Education Consolidation and Improvement Block Grant (ECIBG)  
18 will be used for the administration and provision of education  
19 programs in accordance with the requirements of the Omnibus  
20 Budget Reconciliation Act of 1981.

21 (e) Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant.--The  
22 Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant (PHHSBG) is  
23 for the provision of preventive health and other health services  
24 related to emergency medical comprehensive public health,  
25 hypertension, fluoridation, health education, risk reduction,  
26 home health, rape crisis and rodent control.

27 (f) Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant.--The  
28 Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant (MCHSBG) is to  
29 assure mothers and children access to quality maternal and child  
30 health services, to reduce infant mortality and the incidence of



1 preventable disease and handicapping conditions among children,  
2 to provide rehabilitative services for blind and disabled  
3 individuals under the age of 16 receiving Supplemental Security  
4 Income benefits and to provide medical services for children  
5 with crippling conditions.

6 (g) Alcohol and Drug Abuse and Mental Health Services Block  
7 Grant.--The Alcohol and Drug Abuse and Mental Health Services  
8 Block Grant (ADAMHSBG) will be used for the administration and  
9 provision of drug and alcohol abuse services and community  
10 mental health services in accordance with the requirements of  
11 the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1981.

12 (h) Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant.--The Low-  
13 Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant (LIHEABG) is to help  
14 lessen the impact of the high cost of energy on low-income  
15 families and individuals.

16 (i) Social Services Block Grant.--The Social Services Block  
17 Grant (SSBG) is for the provision of social services to eligible  
18 persons.
