AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 2 Statutes, further providing for antique and classic motor
- 3 vehicles; and providing for collector motor vehicles.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. The definitions of "antique motor vehicle" and
- 7 "classic motor vehicle" in section 102 of Title 75 of the
- 8 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended and the section
- 9 is amended by adding a definition to read:
- 10 § 102. Definitions.
- 11 Subject to additional definitions contained in subsequent
- 12 provisions of this title which are applicable to specific
- 13 provisions of this title, the following words and phrases when
- 14 used in this title shall have, unless the context clearly
- 15 indicates otherwise, the meanings given to them in this section:
- 16 * * *
- 17 "Antique motor vehicle." A motor vehicle, but not a
- 18 reproduction thereof, manufactured more than 25 years prior to

- 1 the current year which has been maintained in or restored to a
- 2 condition which is substantially in conformance with
- 3 manufacturer specifications and appearance.
- 4 * * *
- 5 "Classic motor vehicle." A [self-propelled] motor vehicle,
- 6 but not a reproduction thereof, [manufactured more than ten
- 7 years prior to the current year and, because of discontinued
- 8 production and limited availability, determined by the
- 9 department to be a model or make of significant value to
- 10 collectors or exhibitors and] which is included on the list of
- 11 <u>milestone or classic cars published by the Milestone Car Society</u>
- 12 or the Classic Car Club of America and has been maintained in or
- 13 restored to a condition which is substantially in conformity
- 14 with manufacturer specifications and appearance. Any classic
- 15 motor vehicle registered under section 1340 (relating to antique
- 16 and classic plates) which no longer qualifies as a classic motor
- 17 <u>vehicle under these provisions may retain a classic registration</u>
- 18 as of the effective date of this act unless another type of
- 19 registration is applied for and issued for the vehicle.
- 20 "Collector motor vehicle." A motor vehicle, but not a
- 21 reproduction thereof, manufactured more than ten years prior to
- 22 the current year, which has been maintained in or restored to a
- 23 condition which is substantially in conformity with manufacturer
- 24 specifications and appearance.
- 25 * * *
- 26 Section 2. Section 1340 of Title 75 is amended to read:
- 27 § 1340. Antique and classic plates.
- 28 (a) General rule.--Upon submission by a vehicle owner of
- 29 information satisfactory to the department that a motor vehicle
- 30 is an antique motor vehicle or classic motor vehicle,

- 1 accompanied by the appropriate fee, the department may issue
- 2 special plates for the vehicle. [No annual registration fee may
- 3 be charged for antique or classic motor vehicles.]
- 4 (b) Use of plates.--It is unlawful for any person to operate
- 5 a vehicle with antique or classic registration plates for
- 6 general daily transportation. Permitted use shall be limited to
- 7 participation in club activities, exhibits, tours, parades,
- 8 occasional transportation and similar uses. <u>Occasional</u>
- 9 <u>transportation shall mean no more than one day per week.</u>
- 10 (c) Additional provisions.--
- 11 (1) Antique vehicles and classic vehicles are exempt
- 12 from Chapter 43 (relating to lighting equipment) and
- Subchapter A of Chapter 47 (relating to inspection
- 14 requirements).
- 15 (2) Any registered antique vehicle or classic vehicle
- 16 <u>may bear an original Pennsylvania registration plate of the</u>
- 17 year of issue corresponding to the year of manufacture of the
- 18 registered vehicle. A clear photograph of the plate must be
- 19 submitted together with the application for registration. The
- 20 registered plate must remain in the vehicle at all times.
- 21 Section 3. Title 75 is amended by adding sections to read:
- 22 § 1348. Collector plate.
- 23 <u>Upon submission by a vehicle owner of information</u>
- 24 satisfactory to the department that a motor vehicle is a
- 25 <u>collector motor vehicle</u>, <u>accompanied</u> by the appropriate fee, the
- 26 <u>department may issue a special collector plate for the vehicle</u>,
- 27 which shall have the same force and effect as a regular
- 28 <u>registration plate.</u>
- 29 § 1933. Collector motor vehicles.
- The fee for issuance of a collector motor vehicle plate shall

- 1 be \$20 which shall be in addition to the annual registration fee
- 2 appropriate for the vehicle type. The issuance fee shall be
- 3 charged for each collector vehicle registration plate issued or
- 4 <u>replaced</u>.
- 5 Section 4. Section 4703(b)(10) of Title 75 is amended to
- 6 read:
- 7 § 4703. Operation of vehicle without official certificate of
- 8 inspection.
- 9 * * *
- 10 (b) Exceptions. -- Subsection (a) does not apply to:
- 11 * * *
- 12 (10) Antique <u>and classic</u> vehicles.
- 13 * * *
- 14 Section 5. This act shall take effect immediately.
