1 2 3 4 5 6	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," further providing for school health services and reimbursement for school health services.
7	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8	hereby enacts as follows:
9	Section 1. Section 1402(a.1) of the act of March 10, 1949
10	(P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949,
11	amended December 7, 1965 (P.L.1041, No.390), is amended to read:
12	Section 1402. Health Services* * *
13	(a.1) Every child of school age shall be provided with
14	school nurse services: Provided, however, That the number of
15	general population pupils under the care of each school nurse
16	shall not exceed [one thousand five hundred (1,500)] <u>nine</u>
17	hundred fifty (950) and that the number of pupils with mental
18	and physical handicaps shall not exceed one nurse for every two

hundred twenty-five (225) pupils in the mainstream populations and one nurse for every one hundred twenty-five (125) pupils in the severely or profoundly handicapped population.

5 Section 2. Section 2505.1(a) and (a.1) of the act, amended
6 July 13, 1979 (P.L.94, No.41), are amended to read:

7 Section 2505.1. State Reimbursement for Health Services .--8 (a) Every school district and joint school board which renders health services to children of school age shall be reimbursed by 9 10 the Commonwealth on account of health services which conform to 11 standards approved by the Secretary of Health. Reimbursements shall be paid by the Secretary of Health. The amount thereof 12 13 shall be the actual cost of the medical and dental services and 14 school nurse services as certified to the Secretary of Health, 15 less any charges deemed unreasonable by him, but for medical 16 services shall not for any school year exceed the sum of (1) 17 [one dollar and sixty cents (\$1.60)] two dollars and eighty 18 <u>cents (\$2.80)</u> multiplied by the number of children enrolled in a 19 school for the entire school term of that school year and for 20 whom the school district or joint school board maintains 21 comprehensive health records as defined in section 1402, and (2) 22 a proportionate part of [one dollar and sixty cents (\$1.60)] two dollars and eighty cents (\$2.80) for each child enrolled for a 23 part of the school term of that school year and for whom the 24 25 school district or joint school board maintains a comprehensive 26 health record as defined in section 1402, for dental services 27 shall not for any school year exceed the sum of (1) [eighty 28 cents (\$.80)] one dollar and forty cents (\$1.40) multiplied by the number of children enrolled in a school for the entire 29 30 school term of that school year and for whom the school district 19890H1310B1513 - 2 -

or joint school board maintains comprehensive health records as 1 defined in section 1402, and (2) a proportionate part of [eighty 2 cents (\$.80)] one dollar and forty cents (\$1.40) for each child 3 4 enrolled for a part of the school term of that school year and 5 for whom the school district or joint school board maintains a comprehensive health record as defined in section 1402, and for 6 7 school nurse services shall not for any school year exceed the sum of (1) [seven dollars (\$7.00)] twenty-four dollars and fifty 8 9 cents (\$24.50) multiplied by the district's market value 10 personal income aid ratio, multiplied by the number of children 11 enrolled in a school for the entire school term of that school year, and (2) a proportionate part of [seven dollars (\$7.00)] 12 13 twenty-four dollars and fifty cents (\$24.50) multiplied by the 14 district's market value personal income aid ratio for each child 15 enrolled for a part of the school term of that school year. 16 For the 1989-1990 school year and each year thereafter, no 17 school district shall receive less funding on account of school 18 nurse services than was received for the 1988-1989 school year. 19 (a.1) Every school district or joint school board which 20 employs one or more dental hygienists for the purpose of dental 21 hygiene services to children of school age shall be reimbursed 22 by the Commonwealth on account of such services which conform to 23 standards approved by the Secretary of Health. Reimbursement 24 shall be made by the Secretary of Health. The amount thereof 25 shall be the actual cost of the dental hygiene services as 26 certified to the Secretary of Health, less any charges that 27 shall be deemed unreasonable by him, but for any school year shall not exceed the sum of [two dollars (\$2)] seven dollars 28 (\$7.00) multiplied by the district's market value personal 29 30 income aid ratio multiplied by the actual number of children 19890H1310B1513 - 3 -

1 enrolled in the school for the entire school term [who receive such dental hygiene services,] and a proportionate part of [two 2 3 dollars (\$2)] seven dollars (\$7.00) multiplied by the district's market value personal income aid ratio for each child enrolled 4 for a part of the school term of that school year [and who 5 actually receives dental hygiene services]. Reimbursement under 6 this subsection shall be in lieu of any reimbursement provided 7 in subsection (a) of this section for dental services. 8

9 For the 1989-1990 school year and each year thereafter, no
10 school district shall receive less funding on account of dental
11 hygienist services than was received for the 1988-1989 school
12 year.

13 * * *

Section 3. The increase in reimbursement for nurse services 14 15 provided for under section 2505.1 of the act shall be paid only 16 for nurses employed prior to the effective date of this act. The 17 entire salary of each additional nurse employed by a school 18 district or joint school board in order to comply with the new 19 nurse per pupil ratios established in section 1402(a.1) of the 20 act shall be paid by the Commonwealth. The provisions of section 1402(a.1) of the act shall not become effective until the 21 22 additional funding required under that section is appropriated. 23 Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.

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
