AN ACT

1 Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), entitled,
2 as amended, "An act relating to the finances of the State
3 government; providing for the settlement, assessment,
4 collection, and lien of taxes, bonus, and all other accounts
5 due the Commonwealth, the collection and recovery of fees and
6 other money or property due or belonging to the Commonwealth,
7 or any agency thereof, including escheated property and the
8 proceeds of its sale, the custody and disbursement or other
9 disposition of funds and securities belonging to or in the
10 possession of the Commonwealth, and the settlement of claims
11 against the Commonwealth, the resettlement of accounts and
12 appeals to the courts, refunds of moneys erroneously paid to
13 the Commonwealth, auditing the accounts of the Commonwealth
14 and all agencies thereof, of all public officers collecting
15 moneys payable to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof,
16 and all receipts of appropriations from the Commonwealth,
17 authorizing the Commonwealth to issue tax anticipation notes
18 to defray current expenses, implementing the provisions of
19 section 7(a) of Article VIII of the Constitution of
20 Pennsylvania authorizing and restricting the incurring of
21 certain debt and imposing penalties; affecting every
22 department, board, commission, and officer of the State
23 government, every political subdivision of the State, and
24 certain officers of such subdivisions, every person,
25 association, and corporation required to pay, assess, or
26 collect taxes, or to make returns or reports under the laws
27 imposing taxes for State purposes, or to pay license fees or
28 other moneys to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof,
29 every State depository and every debtor or creditor of the
30 Commonwealth," adding provisions relating to the Private
31 Licensed Schools Fund; and making a repeal.

32 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

1 hereby enacts as follows:

2 Section 1. The introductory paragraph of section 302 of the
3 act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), known as The Fiscal
4 Code, amended May 13, 1959 (P.L.308, No.55), is amended and the
5 section is amended by adding a clause to read:

6 Section 302. Funds.--The moneys paid into the State
7 Treasury, and the moneys of which the State Treasurer is
8 custodian, shall be credited by the Treasury Department to the
9 following funds, as hereinafter provided:

11 Banking Department Fund,
12 Federal Vocational Education Fund,
13 Fire Insurance Tax Fund,
14 Fish Fund,
15 Game Fund,
16 General Fund,
17 Liquid Fuels Tax Fund,

20 School Employees' Retirement Fund,
21 Sinking Fund,
22 State College Experimental Farm Fund,
23 State Employees' Retirement Fund,
24 State Farm Products Show Fund,
25 State Insurance Fund,
26 State School Fund,
27 State Workmen's Insurance Fund,
28 Surplus Commodities Stamp Fund,
29 Historical Preservation Fund,
30 Vocational Rehabilitation Fund,

Rehabilitation Center Fund[.]

Private Licensed Schools Fund.

* * *

25. Private Licensed Schools Fund.--All moneys received by the State Board of Private Licensed Schools, arising from fees, fines or civil penalties charged to private licensed schools, multibranch training schools, and admissions representatives, shall be credited to the Private Licensed Schools Fund.

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Section 2. Section 10(c) of the act of December 15, 1986 (P.L.1585, No.174), known as the Private Licensed Schools Act, is repealed.

Section 3. The provisions of this act shall be retroactive to July 1, 1988.

Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.
