AN ACT

Amending the act of June 29, 1953 (P.L.304, No.66), entitled "An 1 act providing for the administration of a statewide system of 2 3 vital statistics; prescribing the functions of the State 4 Department of Health, the State Advisory Health Board and 5 local registrars; imposing duties upon coroners, prothonotaries, clerks of orphans' court, physicians, 6 7 midwives and other persons; requiring reports and 8 certificates for the registration of vital statistics; 9 regulating the disposition of dead bodies; limiting the disclosure of records; prescribing the sufficiency of vital 10 statistics records as evidence; prescribing fees and 11 penalties; and revising and consolidating the laws relating 12 thereto," requiring parents to furnish Social Security 13 14 numbers; and providing for missing children registration. 15 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

16 hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 401 of the act of June 29, 1953 (P.L.304, No.66), known as the Vital Statistics Law of 1953, is amended to read:

20 Section 401. Birth Registration: General Provisions.--A

21 certificate of each birth occurring in this Commonwealth shall

be filed with the local registrar of the district in which the 2 birth occurs within a period prescribed by regulations of the 3 Advisory Health Board. The certificate shall be prepared, signed 4 and filed by the attending physician or licensed midwife, except 5 that when there is no attending physician or licensed midwife the certificate shall be prepared, signed and filed (1) by the 6 father, or (2) in the event of his death, disability or absence, 7 by the mother, or (3) in the event of her death or disability, 8 9 by the householder of the premises or superintendent of the 10 institution in which the birth occurs, or (4) in the event of 11 the absence or disability of all persons heretofore named, then 12 by such person acquainted with the facts as the local registrar 13 shall designate. The Social Security number or numbers of each 14 parent shall be obtained and maintained separately by the 15 department in a fashion that permits routine screened inquiries, 16 unless there is good cause for not requiring the furnishing of 17 such number or numbers in accordance with Federal regulations. 18 This information is considered confidential and is to be made available only to Federal and State agencies responsible for 19 20 establishing paternity or enforcing child support orders. 21 Section 2. Section 403 of the act, added July 3, 1957 22 (P.L.443, No.247), is amended to read: 23 Section 403. Birth Registration: Children Born in a Country 24 Other Than the United States. -- The department shall, upon 25 request, complete and register birth certificates for any child 26 born in a country other than the United States when either 27 parent is a citizen of the United States and a resident of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Such certificates shall show the 28 true country and date of birth, and that the certificate is not 29 30 evidence of the United States citizenship of the registrant. For 19890H1665B3682 - 2 -

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1	such registration the department shall require proof of parental
2	United States citizenship and of Pennsylvania residence. <u>The</u>
3	Social Security number or numbers of each parent are to be
4	recorded and maintained as required in section 401. Certified
5	copies of such certificates shall be issued upon application and
б	payment of the prescribed fee.
7	Section 3. The act is amended by adding an article to read:
8	Article IV-A. Missing Children Registration
9	Section 401-A. Missing Children Registration: Definitions
10	<u>As used in this act</u>
11	(1) "Division" means the Division of Vital Records of the
12	Department of Health.
13	(2) "Investigating law enforcement agency" means the
14	Pennsylvania State Police or local police force responsible for
15	investigating missing persons or children reports within the
16	political subdivision where the child was reported lost,
17	abducted, missing or runaway.
18	<u>(3) "Missing child" means an individual under eighteen (18)</u>
19	years of age who is reported to a law enforcement agency as
20	<u>abducted, lost, missing or a runaway.</u>
21	(4) "School district" means the last known school which the
22	missing child attended.
23	(5) "State Police" means the Pennsylvania State Police.
24	Section 402 A. Missing Children Registration: Investigating
25	Law Enforcement Agency. An investigating law enforcement agency
26	may report to the State Police and the school district that an
27	<u>individual under eighteen (18) years of age is lost, abducted,</u>
28	missing or a runaway. The State Police shall notify the division
29	within fifteen (15) days of receipt of a report for the purpose
30	specified in section 403 A of this act. Upon recovery of a child
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1	who was the subject of a report, the investigating law	
2	enforcement agency shall notify the school district and the	
3	State Police who shall notify the division.	
4	SECTION 402-A. MISSING CHILDREN REGISTRATION: INVESTIGATING <-	
5	LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY AN INVESTIGATING LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY	
6	MAY REPORT TO THE SCHOOL DISTRICT AND IMMEDIATELY NOTIFY THE	
7	DIVISION FOR THE PURPOSE SPECIFIED IN SECTION 403-A OF THIS ACT,	
8	THAT AN INDIVIDUAL UNDER EIGHTEEN (18) YEARS OF AGE IS LOST,	
9	ABDUCTED, MISSING OR A RUNAWAY. THE INVESTIGATING LAW	
10	ENFORCEMENT AGENCY SHALL NOTIFY THE SCHOOL DISTRICT AND THE	
11	DIVISION UPON RECOVERY OF A CHILD WHO WAS THE SUBJECT OF A	
12	REPORT.	
13	Section 403-A. Missing Children Registration: Notations on	
14	Birth and School RecordsIf the division receives notification	
15	of a missing child, it shall make a notation on the birth	
16	certificate record of the missing child so that, if that birth	
17	certificate is requested, the division will be alerted to the	
18	fact that the birth certificate is that of a missing child. When	
19	the division is notified of the recovery of a missing child, it	
20	shall remove the notation. When a school receives notification	
21	of a missing child, it shall make a notation on the school	
22	record of the missing child so that, if that school record is	
23	requested, the school will be alerted to the fact that the	
24	school record is that of a missing child. If the school is	
25	notified of the recovery of a missing child, it shall remove the	
26	notation.	
27	Section 404-A. Missing Children Registration: Requests for	
28	informationWhen the division or a school receives a request	
29	for information from a record which has a "Missing Child"	
30	notation, no information contained in the record shall be	

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1 released to the requester prior to contact with the

2 <u>investigating law enforcement agency</u>. The division and schools

3 shall make an effort to obtain information to identify the

4 person whose request is verbal. The division or school receiving

5 the request shall contact the investigating law enforcement

- 6 agency to coordinate the response.
- 7 Section 4. This act shall take effect in 90 days.
