A RESOLUTION

- 1 Committing the House of Representatives to the establishment of 2 a special committee to study the problem of radon gas in the
- 3 environment, to hold hearings, to review scientific data and
- 4 to make recommendations for legislation.
- 5 WHEREAS, The problems associated with the presence of radon
- 6 gas in the environment and, in particular, in the homes and
- 7 public waters of this Commonwealth have been receiving a great
- 8 deal of public attention; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The General Assembly needs to be informed of the
- 10 latest developments in this area and of legislation which may
- 11 need to be enacted; therefore be it
- 12 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 13 importance of the radon problem and the possible need for
- 14 legislative action to help solve the problem; and be it further
- 15 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives commit itself to
- 16 the appointment of a special committee to study the radon

- problem and, in particular, the problem of radon in the homes
- and public waters of this Commonwealth; and be it further
- 3 RESOLVED, That the committee hold hearings, study scientific
- reports and data and make recommendations with respect to 4
- legislation within six months of its appointment. 5
