## A RESOLUTION

Designating February 16, 1989, as "Elks American Patriotism Day" in celebration of the Elks' 121st Anniversary.

WHEREAS, The Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks is one of the oldest and largest fraternal organizations in the United States, having held its first formal meeting on February 16 , 1868, in New York City; and

WHEREAS, The Elks, with patriotism being the hallmark of this organization, became the first organization to observe June 14 as Flag Day. More than 40 years later, fellow Elk, President Harry S. Truman, signed an order proclaiming Flag Day as an official national holiday; and

WHEREAS, The Elks, in the interest of education, have awarded scholarships to 500 outstanding high school students and emergency educational grants to needy students; and

WHEREAS, The Elks, being a civic-minded organization, contributed $\$ 26$ million in 1983 to support cerebral palsy research, veterans' hospitals, retarded child care and other
services to aid the handicapped; and
WHEREAS, On February 16, 1989, the objective of the Elks is to have the colors of the American flag, red, white and blue, displayed by everyone; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania designate February 16, 1989, as "Elks American Patriotism Day" in celebration of the 121st Anniversary of this venerable organization; and be it further RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be transmitted to Robert H. Stanley, Past Exalted Ruler of the Pittsburgh South Hills Lodge No. 2213, Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks, Pennsylvania Elks All American Lodge 1984-1985.
