A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- 1 Urging the Congress of the United States to propose an amendment
- 2 to the Constitution to memorialize the American flag.
- 3 WHEREAS, It would be fitting and appropriate for the Congress
- of the United States, acting by consent of two-thirds of both
- 5 Houses thereof, to propose an amendment to the Constitution of
- the United States to memorialize the American flag; and 6
- 7 WHEREAS, The American flag is a cherished and unique symbol
- in our nation; and 8
- 9 WHEREAS, Countless American lives have been sacrificed to
- 10 preserve the American flag as an emblem of our freedoms; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The American flag is venerated by millions of
- 12 Americans; and
- WHEREAS, Under Article V of the Constitution of the United 13
- 14 States, amendments to the Constitution may be proposed by
- 15 Congress whenever two-thirds of both Houses deem it necessary;
- 16 and
- WHEREAS, We believe such action to be vital; therefore be it 17

- 1 RESOLVED (the Senate concurring), That the General Assembly
- 2 of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania request the Congress of the
- 3 United States to prepare and submit to the several states an
- 4 amendment to the Constitution of the United States consecrating
- 5 the American flag and prohibiting its desecration; and be it
- 6 further
- 7 RESOLVED, That the General Assembly also propose that the
- 8 Legislature of each of the several states apply to Congress
- 9 requesting the enactment of an appropriate amendment to the
- 10 Constitution of the United States; and be it further
- 11 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to
- 12 the Secretary of State and the presiding officers of each house
- 13 of the Legislature of every state in the Union; and be it
- 14 further
- 15 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to
- 16 the presiding officers of each house of Congress and to each
- 17 member of Congress from Pennsylvania.
