#### A RESOLUTION

5	WHEREAS, It is the function of government to establish
6	policies and manage programs established by or pursuant to law;

8	WHEREAS, It is the function of the private enterprise system,
9	which is the primary source of economic strength, to provide
10	goods and services needed in that endeavor; and
11	WHEREAS, Optimum efficiency, economy and productivity can
12	often be achieved if government relies on competitive
13	procurements from private enterprise for its needs, goods and
14	services; and
15	WHEREAS, In a democratic, free enterprise system, the
16	government should work to insure that quality standards are met
17	at the least possible cost to taxpayers; therefore be it
18	RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission appoint

a task force to conduct a thorough study of ways in which the
 Commonwealth can provide government services at minimal public
 cost by utilizing, where appropriate, private enterprise; and be

 RESOLVED, That the task force may appoint an advisory
