AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, defining an offense relating to
- 3 graffiti and other vandalism of property; providing
- 4 penalties; and making repeals.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Sections 3307 and 3309 of Title 18 of the
- 8 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are repealed.
- 9 Section 2. Title 18 is amended by adding a section to read:
- 10 § 3310. Graffiti and vandalism.
- 11 (a) Offense defined. -- It shall be unlawful for any person to
- 12 knowingly deface, vandalize, mark or paint upon, desecrate as
- 13 defined in section 5509 (relating to desecration of venerated
- 14 objects), or otherwise damage any of the following:
- 15 (1) Any church, synagogue or other facility or place
- 16 used for religious worship or other religious purposes.
- 17 (2) Any cemetery, mortuary or other facility used for

- 1 the purpose of burial or memorializing the dead.
- 2 (3) Any school, educational facility, community center,
- 3 <u>municipal building, courthouse facility or juvenile detention</u>
- 4 <u>center</u>.
- 5 (4) The grounds adjacent to and owned or occupied by any
- 6 <u>facility set forth in paragraph (1), (2) or (3).</u>
- 7 (5) Any personal property located in any facility set
- 8 forth in this subsection.
- 9 (6) Any real or personal property used in farming or
- 10 <u>other agricultural activity.</u>
- 11 (7) Any other real or personal property.
- 12 <u>(b) Grading.--</u>
- 13 (1) For an adult, a first offense constitutes a
- misdemeanor of the second degree, punishable by a period of
- community service, the length and type of which shall be
- determined by the court.
- 17 (2) For an adult, a second offense constitutes a
- 18 misdemeanor of the first degree.
- 19 (3) For an adult, a third or subsequent offense
- 20 <u>constitutes a felony of the second degree.</u>
- 21 (4) For a minor, a first offense constitutes a
- 22 misdemeanor of the third degree, punishable by a period of
- 23 community service, the length and type of which shall be
- 24 <u>determined by the court.</u>
- 25 (5) For a minor, a second offense constitutes a
- 26 <u>misdemeanor of the second degree, punishable by a term to be</u>
- 27 served in a motivational boot camp, as the court shall
- 28 <u>direct.</u>
- 29 <u>(6) For a minor, a third or subsequent offense</u>
- 30 constitutes a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable by

- 1 <u>a term to be served in a juvenile detention center, as the</u>
- 2 court shall direct.
- 3 <u>(c) Restitution.--</u>
- 4 (1) In addition to any penalty imposed under subsection
- 5 (b), the court shall sentence an adult offender, or the
- 6 parents or legal quardian of a minor offender, to make full
- 7 <u>restitution to the victim of the offense for all of the</u>
- 8 <u>victim's pecuniary loss.</u>
- 9 (2) In the case of an adult, restitution shall be
- 10 <u>imposed under section 1106 (relating to restitution for</u>
- injuries to person or property). An order for restitution in
- connection with an offense under this section shall, however,
- be mandatory and for the full amount of the victim's loss.
- 14 (3) In the case of a minor, restitution shall be imposed
- 15 <u>under 23 Pa.C.S. § 5503 (relating to establishing liability</u>
- in criminal or juvenile proceedings). The provisions of 23
- Pa.C.S. § 5505 (relating to monetary limits of liability)
- 18 shall not, however, apply. The imposition of restitution
- 19 shall be mandatory and for the full amount of the victim's
- loss.
- 21 (4) The amount of pecuniary loss in relation to damage
- 22 of real property shall be ascertained by a certified
- 23 Pennsylvania evaluator.
- 24 (d) Motivational boot camp. -- The Department of Corrections
- 25 shall, by regulation, establish a juvenile motivational boot
- 26 camp program in this Commonwealth. These regulations shall
- 27 provide for the establishment, location and operation of these
- 28 camps. These camps shall provide rigorous physical activity,
- 29 <u>intensive regimentation and discipline and counseling.</u>
- 30 (e) Definitions.--As used in this section, the term "minor"

- 1 means a person under 18 years of age.
- Section 2. All acts and parts of acts are repealed insofar 2
- 3 as they are inconsistent with this act.
- Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days. 4
