AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), entitled "An
- 2 act to consolidate, editorially revise, and codify the public
 - welfare laws of the Commonwealth, "further providing for the
- 4 inspection of child day-care centers.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:

- 7 Section 1. Section 1016 of the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31,
- 8 No.21), known as the Public Welfare Code, amended July 15, 1976
- 9 (P.L.993, No.202), is amended to read:
- 10 Section 1016. Right to Enter and Inspect.--(a) For the
- 11 purpose of determining the suitability of the applicants and of
- 12 the premises or whether or not any premises in fact qualifies as
- 13 a facility as defined in section 1001 of this act or the
- 14 continuing conformity of the licensees to this act and to the
- 15 applicable regulations of the department, any authorized agent
- 16 of the department shall have the right to enter, visit and
- 17 inspect any facility licensed or requiring a license under this

- 1 act and shall have full and free access to the records of the
- 2 facility and to the individuals therein and full opportunity to
- 3 interview, inspect or examine such individuals.
- 4 (b) An authorized agent of the department shall also confer
- 5 with the operators of facilities regarding the minimum standards
- 6 of the department, encourage the adoption of higher standards
- 7 and recommend methods of improving care and services.
- 8 (c) The department shall conduct at least two unannounced
- 9 <u>inspections of every child day-care center each calendar year.</u>
- 10 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
