## AN ACT

- Amending the act of June 22, 1937 (P.L.1987, No.394), entitled, as amended, "An act to preserve and improve the purity of the 2 waters of the Commonwealth for the protection of public 3 health, animal and aquatic life, and for industrial 4 5 consumption, and recreation; empowering and directing the 6 creation of indebtedness or the issuing of non-debt revenue bonds by political subdivisions to provide works to abate pollution; providing protection of water supply and water 7 8 9 quality; providing for the jurisdiction of courts in the enforcement thereof; providing additional remedies for 10 abating pollution of waters; imposing certain penalties; 11 repealing certain acts; regulating discharges of sewage and 12 13 industrial wastes; regulating the operation of mines and 14 regulating the impact of mining upon water quality, supply and quantity; placing responsibilities upon landowners and 15 land occupiers and to maintain primary jurisdiction over 16 surface coal mining in Pennsylvania." exempting from permits 17 18 and fees certain low-output mines.
- 19 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 20 hereby enacts as follows:
- 21 Section 1. Section 6 of the act of June 22, 1937 (P.L.1987,
- 22 No.394), known as The Clean Streams Law, amended October 10,
- 23 1980 (P.L.894, No.157), is amended to read:
- 24 Section 6. Application and Permit Fees.--(a) The department
- 25 is hereby authorized to charge and collect from persons and
- 26 municipalities in accordance with its rules and regulations

- 1 reasonable filing fees for applications filed and for permits
- 2 issued.
- (b) This section shall not apply to persons who mine one 3
- 4 thousand tons or less of marketable minerals per year.
- Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days. 5
