## AN ACT

Amending the act of April 29, 1937 (P.L.487, No.115), entitled, 2 as reenacted and amended, "An act to provide for the 3 permanent personal registration of electors in cities of the second class, cities of the second class A, cities of the third class, boroughs, towns, and townships as a condition of 5 their right to vote at elections and primaries, and their 6 7 enrollment as members of political parties as a further 8 condition of their right to vote at primaries; prescribing certain procedure for the conduct of elections and primaries 9 10 and the challenge and proof of qualifications of electors; 11 requiring the county commissioners of the various counties to 12 act as a registration commission therefor; and prescribing 13 the powers and duties of citizens, parties, political bodies, 14 registration commissions, commissioners, registrars, 15 inspectors of registration and other appointees of registration commissions, county election boards, election 16 17 officers, municipal officers, departments and bureaus, police 18 officers, courts, judges, prothonotaries, sheriffs, county 19 commissioners, peace officers, county treasurers, county 20 controllers, registrars of vital statistics, certain public 21 utility corporations, real estate brokers, rental agents, and 22 boards of school directors; and imposing penalties," 23 providing for voter registration in conjunction with motor 24 vehicle driver's license registration.

- The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 26 hereby enacts as follows:

- 1 Section 1. The act of April 29, 1937 (P.L.487, No.115),
- 2 known as The Permanent Registration Act for Cities of the Second
- 3 Class, Cities of the Second Class A, Cities of the Third Class,
- 4 Boroughs, Towns, and Townships, reenacted and amended May 31,
- 5 1955 (P.L.62, No.32), is amended by adding a section to read:
- 6 <u>Section 19.1. Motor Vehicle Driver's License Voter</u>
- 7 Registration Application. -- (a) (1) In addition to any other
- 8 method provided under law, each application for a driver's
- 9 <u>license</u>, as defined in 75 Pa.C.S. § 102 (relating to
- 10 <u>definitions</u>), and any renewal application, shall serve as an
- 11 application to register to vote.
- 12 (2) An application for voter registration submitted to the
- 13 <u>Department of Transportation under this section shall be</u>
- 14 considered as updating any previous voter registration
- 15 <u>information</u> by the applicant.
- 16 (3) Each driver's license application shall include a box or
- 17 other device to permit an applicant to decline to register to
- 18 vote. Use of this information for any other purpose is
- 19 prohibited.
- 20 (b) (1) The Department of Transportation shall include a
- 21 voter registration application form as part of an application
- 22 for a driver's license.
- 23 (2) The content of the driver's license/voter registration
- 24 application shall be determined and prescribed by the Secretary
- 25 of the Commonwealth and the Secretary of Transportation through
- 26 <u>regulation</u>.
- 27 (3) The voter registration application portion of an
- 28 application for a State motor vehicle driver's license: (i) may
- 29 not require any information which duplicates information
- 30 required in the driver's license portion of the form, other than

- 1 <u>a second signature or other information as necessary; (ii) shall</u>
- 2 <u>include a means by which an applicant may decline to register to</u>
- 3 <u>vote; (iii) may require only the minimum amount of information</u>
- 4 necessary to prevent duplicate voter registration, to enable the
- 5 <u>commission to assess the eligibility of the applicant and to</u>
- 6 administer voter registration and other parts of the election
- 7 process; (iv) shall include a declaration of eligibility; (v)
- 8 shall require the signature of the applicant, under penalty of
- 9 <u>perjury; and (vi) shall be made available to the appropriate</u>
- 10 registration commission.
- 11 (c) Any change of address form submitted in accordance with
- 12 State law for purposes of State motor vehicle driver's license
- 13 shall serve as notification of change of address for voter
- 14 registration with respect to elections for State office for the
- 15 applicant involved if the applicant states on the form that the
- 16 change of address is for voter registration purposes as well as
- 17 for purposes of the license to operate a motor vehicle.
- 18 (d) (1) The Department of Transportation shall forward the
- 19 completed voter registration information to the Department of
- 20 State or the appropriate commission as determined by regulation.
- 21 (2) Upon receipt of the completed voter registration
- 22 information from the Department of Transportation or the
- 23 Department of State, the commission shall make an entry of the
- 24 date received on each application and process the application.
- 25 No applicant shall be deemed eligible to vote until the
- 26 commission has received and processed the application.
- 27 (e) The Secretary of the Commonwealth shall have the primary
- 28 responsibility for implementing and enforcing the driver's
- 29 <u>license voter registration system created under this section.</u>
- 30 The Secretary of the Commonwealth, in conjunction with the

- 1 <u>Secretary of the Department of Transportation, shall promulgate</u>
- 2 rules and regulations for implementing and enforcing this
- 3 section.
- 4 Section 2. This act shall take effect January 1, 1993.
