## AN ACT

- 1 Requiring retail motor vehicle fuel stations to have air pumps
  2 for the public; and providing penalties.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Duty of retail motor vehicle fuel station owners.
- 6 (a) General rule.--Every retail motor vehicle fuel station
- 7 owner shall make available to the public a power driven air pump
- 8 device for the purpose of inflating motor vehicle tires. The
- 9 device shall be available for public use at all times that the
- 10 station is open for business, except that when the pump becomes
- 11 inoperable for any reason, the owner shall not be in violation
- 12 of this act if the owner exercises due diligence to repair the
- 13 device or provide another operable device as soon as
- 14 practicable. Nothing in this act shall preclude any retail motor
- 15 vehicle fuel station from charging a fee for this service.
- 16 (b) Penalty.--Any retail motor vehicle fuel station owner
- 17 who violates this act commits a summary offense and shall, upon

- 1 conviction, for the first offense be sentenced to pay a fine not
- 2 exceeding \$300 and for a second and each subsequent offense be
- 3 sentenced to pay a fine not exceeding \$1,000.
- 4 (c) Definition.--As used in this act the term "retail motor
- 5 vehicle fuel station owner" means any person, firm or
- 6 corporation maintaining a place of business where motor vehicle
- 7 fuel is sold and dispensed into the tanks of motor vehicles,
- 8 either by means of a self-service or full-service pump, whether
- 9 or not motor vehicles are serviced or another business is
- 10 conducted on the premises.
- 11 Section 2. Effective date.
- 12 This act shall take effect in 120 days.
