AN ACT

1 Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania
2 Consolidated Statutes, further providing for missing
3 children.

4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5 hereby enacts as follows:

6 Section 1. Section 2908(a) of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania
7 Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a paragraph to read:

8 § 2908. Missing children.

9 (a) Duties of law enforcement agencies.--Law enforcement
10 agencies shall have the following duties with respect to missing
11 children:

12 * * *

13 (3.1) To make an entry into the ~~Missing~~ UNIDENTIFIED

14 Persons File through Commonwealth Law Enforcement Assistance

1 Network (CLEAN) in accord with Pennsylvania State Police
2 policy and procedures immediately upon:

3 (i) taking custody of an unidentified living child,
4 such as an infant, ~~a retarded child or a mute~~ OR A ←
5 PHYSICALLY OR MENTALLY DISABLED CHILD; or

6 (ii) discovering an unidentified deceased child.

7 * * *

8 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
