## A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth
- of Pennsylvania, further providing for qualifications of
- 3 justices and judges.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby resolves as follows:
- 6 Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of
- 7 Pennsylvania is proposed in accordance with Article XI:
- 8 That section 12 of Article V be amended to read:
- 9 § 12. Qualifications of justices, judges and justices of the
- peace.
- 11 (a) Justices, judges and justices of the peace shall be
- 12 citizens of the Commonwealth. Justices and judges, except the
- 13 judges of the traffic court in the City of Philadelphia, shall
- 14 be members of the bar of the Supreme Court. Justices and judges
- 15 of statewide courts, for a period of one year preceding their
- 16 election or appointment and during their continuance in office,
- 17 shall reside within the Commonwealth. Other judges and justices

- 1 of the peace, for a period of one year preceding their election
- 2 or appointment and during their continuance in office, shall
- 3 reside within their respective districts, except as provided in
- 4 this article for temporary assignments. For a period of ten
- 5 years preceding their election or appointment, judges of the
- 6 courts of common pleas shall have practiced law or have been
- 7 <u>engaged in a law-related occupation</u>. Justices and judges of the
- 8 Superior Court and Commonwealth Court shall, for an aggregate of
- 9 ten years preceding their election or appointment, have
- 10 practiced law, have served as a judge of the court of common
- 11 pleas or have been engaged in a law-related occupation.
- 12 (b) Judges of the traffic court in the City of Philadelphia
- 13 and justices of the peace shall be members of the bar of the
- 14 Supreme Court or shall complete a course of training and
- 15 instruction in the duties of their respective offices and pass
- 16 an examination prior to assuming office. Such courses and
- 17 examinations shall be as provided by law.
