## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the 50th Anniversary of the Civil Service Commission
- 2 of the Commonwealth and commending it for its high standards
- 3 of administration.
- 4 WHEREAS, Governor Arthur H. James signed the Civil Service
- 5 Act on August 5, 1941, creating a merit system of employment
- 6 administered by an independent commission known as the Civil
- 7 Service Commission; and
- 8 WHEREAS, When initiated, the merit system included 14,000
- 9 member-employees, who worked for the Department of Public
- 10 Assistance, Bureau of Employment Security, Liquor Control Board
- 11 and the Civil Service Commission; and
- 12 WHEREAS, By resolution dated September 10, 1956, and later
- 13 amendments the Executive Board of the Commonwealth expanded the
- 14 merit system to include 13,000 professional and technical
- 15 positions; and
- 16 WHEREAS, On August 26, 1963, Governor William W. Scranton
- 17 approved a major expansion for the merit system extending

- 1 coverage to more than half of the Commonwealth's workforce
- 2 thereby creating a single, uniform and modern system for all
- 3 civil servants, increasing the number of civil servants from
- 4 27,000 to 45,000 and the number of covered positions rose from
- 5 32,000 to 50,000; and
- 6 WHEREAS, During the 1970's, the act was amended again to
- 7 extend merit system coverage to State departments, boards,
- 8 commissions and to political subdivisions of the Commonwealth at
- 9 their request; and
- 10 WHEREAS, At present, there are 60,000 civil servants in the
- 11 merit system working in 36 State agencies and another 7,000 in
- 12 local government working in one of 298 local government agencies
- 13 located throughout the Commonwealth in mental health/mental
- 14 retardation; children and youth services; area agencies on
- 15 aging; emergency management; housing authorities, and drug and
- 16 alcohol units; therefore be it
- 17 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 18 50th Anniversary of the Civil Service Commission of the
- 19 Commonwealth; and be it further
- 20 RESOLVED, That the Civil Service Commission be commended for
- 21 its high standards of administration of the State merit system
- 22 of employment; and be it further
- 23 RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be transmitted to
