A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 2 3	Memorializing the Office of Drug and Alcohol Programs of the Department of Health to educate the public on the effects of alcohol.
4	WHEREAS, A substantial portion of the public considers
5	alcohol to be a major national concern; and
6	WHEREAS, The costs of lost productivity and employment,
7	medical care and damages incurred during alcohol-related
8	incidents negate the revenues derived from taxes on the sale of
9	alcohol; and
10	WHEREAS, Alcohol is a major factor in many cases of child
11	abuse, divorce, suicide and rape; and
12	WHEREAS, Alcohol is a leading contributor to premature deaths
13	and fatal and debilitating accidents, particularly those
14	involving vehicles; and
15	WHEREAS, Alcohol may cause brain cell destruction, cirrhosis
16	of the liver, cancers in the digestive tract and heart disease;
17	and
18	WHEREAS, Alcohol consumption during pregnancy can cause birth

1 defects; and

2 WHEREAS, Alcoholism is officially recognized by the American
3 Medical Association as a disease; and

WHEREAS, Increased public knowledge about the dangers of alcohol may convince individuals to monitor levels of alcoholic intake which may lead to a reduction of or an abstinence from alcohol consumption; therefore be it

8 RESOLVED (the Senate concurring), That the General Assembly 9 memorialize the Office of Drug and Alcohol Programs of the 10 Department of Health to develop and implement a Statewide 11 educational campaign program which will provide information 12 concerning the possible consequences of the use and abuse of 13 alcohol; and be it further

14 RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be transmitted to 15 the Secretary of Health and the Deputy Secretary of Drug and 16 Alcohol Programs.
