AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of July 3, 1986 (P.L.388, No.84), entitled "An
- 2 act requiring public agencies to hold certain meetings and
- 3 hearings open to the public; and providing penalties,"
- 4 providing for public comment.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. The act of July 3, 1986 (P.L.388, No.84), known
- 8 as the Sunshine Act, is amended by adding a section to read:
- 9 <u>Section 10.1. Public comment.</u>
- 10 (A) GENERAL RULE. -- The board or council of any county, city, <---
- 11 borough, town, township or school district shall provide a
- 12 reasonable opportunity at each REGULAR meeting for residents and <---
- 13 taxpayers to address the board or council on matters of concern
- 14 <u>IN THAT COUNTY, CITY, BOROUGH, TOWN, TOWNSHIP OR SCHOOL</u> <
- 15 DISTRICT. In addition, nothing in this section shall limit the
- 16 ability of the board or council of any county, city, borough,
- 17 town, township or school district to conduct special meetings to

- receive comments from residents and taxpayers; provided,
- 2 <u>however</u>, that such special meetings be convened within 30 days
- 3 <u>of the regular meeting which created the need for the special</u>
- meeting. IN ADVANCE OF THE NEXT REGULAR MEETING. 4
- 5 (B) JUDICIAL RELIEF UNAVAILABLE. -- A VIOLATION OF SUBSECTION
- 6 (A) SHALL NOT BE GROUNDS FOR JUDICIAL RELIEF UNDER SECTION 13.
- 7 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
