AN ACT

- 1 Relating to rural health care; providing for voice, video or
- data communication links; establishing eligibility criteria;
- 3 AND providing for duties of the Bureau of Planning within the
- 4 Department of Health; and making an appropriation.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Short title.
- 8 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Med-Link
- 9 Pilot Program Act.
- 10 Section 2. Definitions.
- 11 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 12 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 13 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 14 "Bureau." The Bureau of Planning within the Department of
- 15 Health.
- 16 "Med-Link." A voice, video or data communication and

- 1 information network between rural health care providers and
- 2 sources of medical expertise, support, data, information and
- 3 training.
- 4 "Med-Link Pilot Program." A program administered by the
- 5 bureau to develop voice, video or data communication and
- 6 information networks; review applications; and provide technical
- 7 and financial assistance to participants.
- 8 "Rural health care provider." Any hospital, health care
- 9 professional or other licensed health care unit located in a
- 10 geographic area with a population size and density determined by
- 11 the bureau.
- 12 Section 3. Med-Link Pilot Program.
- 13 (a) Establishment.--There is created a Med-Link Pilot
- 14 Program, which shall be administered by the bureau.
- 15 (b) Grants.--The bureau shall provide grants from the sums
- 16 appropriated to establish Med-Link systems linking rural health
- 17 care providers with other sources of medical support, data,
- 18 information and training.
- 19 Section 4. Eliqibility.
- 20 The bureau shall consider grant proposals addressing the
- 21 health care information and communication needs of rural areas
- 22 offered by applicants who can demonstrate innovative
- 23 applications of telecommunication and information technologies
- 24 linking rural health care providers with sources of medical
- 25 support, data, information and training. To be considered for
- 26 grants, proposals must do all of the following:
- 27 (1) Account for the number of hospitals and other
- institutions which will be linked by the Med-Link system.
- 29 (2) Accurately estimate the number of rural residents
- who will be the indirect beneficiaries of the Med-Link grant.

- 1 (3) Provide information on how the programs will operate
- on a 24-hour basis and incorporate back-up systems.
- 3 (4) Improve rural access to a continuum of health care
- 4 information and services.
- 5 (5) Result in illness prevention and improved care.
- 6 (6) Capitalize on technology and communication networks.
- 7 Section 5. Technical assistance.
- 8 The bureau shall provide technical expertise to health care
- 9 providers interested in establishing a program. The bureau may
- 10 consult with private industries, consultants, academic research
- 11 institutes and other individuals or organizations involved in
- 12 telecommunications and information networks.
- 13 Section 6. Grant amounts.
- Grants shall be awarded in amounts ranging from \$15,000 to
- 15 \$45,000 a year and may be awarded for a period not to exceed
- 16 three years. In determining the amount of an award, the bureau
- 17 shall consider the scope of the program, the number of health
- 18 care providers and consumer entities involved and the likely
- 19 increase in access to and availability of health care
- 20 information and services to rural residents.
- 21 Section 7. Reports.
- The grantees shall be monitored by the bureau and shall
- 23 prepare reports as the bureau requires. If it is determined that
- 24 a grantee is using grant funds for purposes inconsistent with
- 25 this act, the bureau shall require repayment of all or part of
- 26 the grant to the Commonwealth.
- 27 Section 8. Further duties of bureau.
- 28 To promote maximum effectiveness of any program created under
- 29 this act, the bureau shall do all of the following:
- 30 (1) Arrange for the waiver of administrative impediments

- 1 to the implementation of the program, so long as the waiver
- is consistent with the health, safety and general welfare of
- 3 the rural residents who are the indirect beneficiaries of the
- 4 information and services.
- 5 (2) Consult with Federal, State and local officials to
- 6 secure the coordination of related programs and obtain
- 7 waivers.
- 8 (3) Provide the General Assembly with legislative
- 9 recommendations to facilitate the provisions of this act.
- 10 Section 9. Appropriation.
- 11 The sum of \$425,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary,

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- 12 is hereby appropriated to the Bureau of Planning for the fiscal
- 13 year July 1, 1993, to June 30, 1994, for start up costs and
- 14 expenses of the bureau.
- 15 Section 10 9. Effective date.
- 16 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
