AN ACT

1 Amending the act of October 10, 1974 (P.L.705, No.235), entitled
2 "An act providing for the training and licensing of watch
3 guards, protective patrolmen, detectives and criminal
4 investigators, carrying and using lethal weapons in their
5 employment; imposing powers and duties on the Commissioner of
6 the Pennsylvania State Police; and providing penalties,"
7 further defining "privately employed agents."

8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
9 hereby enacts as follows:

10 Section 1. The definition of "privately employed agents" in
11 section 3 of the act of October 10, 1974 (P.L.705, No.235),
12 known as the Lethal Weapons Training Act, amended December 14,
13 1982 (P.L.1209, No.278), is amended to read:

14 Section 3. Definitions.--As used in this act:

15 * * *

16 "Privately employed agents" include any person employed for
17 the purpose of providing watch guard, protective patrol,
18 detective or criminal investigative services either for another

1 for a fee or for his employer. Privately employed agents do not
2 include local, State or Federal Government employees or those
3 police officers commissioned by the Governor under the act of
4 February 27, 1865 (P.L.225, No.228). The term shall include a
5 police officer of a municipal authority. The term shall include
6 any person who carries a lethal weapon which is incident to his
7 employment or appointment.

8 * * *

9 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
