8	Section 1. Section 6109(d) of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania

L2	(d) Prior approval by department
L3	(1) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (a),
L4	the department may require local authorities to obtain
L5	department approval in advance of regulating traffic on
L6	State-designated highways within their physical boundaries.
L7	(2) Local authorities may petition the department to
L8	prohibit the use of two-lane State highways by commercial
L9	vehicles with three or more axles when the particular two-

- 1 lane State highway passes through a scenic, historic,
- 2 <u>residential or hazardous area. The petition shall set forth</u>
- 3 <u>the reasons for the prohibition and reasonable alternatives</u>
- for the movement of the prohibited commercial vehicles. The
- 5 <u>department shall review the petition and make its</u>
- 6 <u>determination based on:</u>
- 7 <u>(i) The significance and extent of the area to be</u>
- 8 restricted.
- 9 <u>(ii) The design and condition of the State highway.</u>
- 10 (iii) The availability of feasible and reasonable
- 11 <u>alternate routes for the prohibited vehicles.</u>
- 12 (iv) Any information gained from any traffic
- engineering study.
- 14 A copy of any traffic engineering study relied on by the
- department shall accompany any decision on a petition by the
- 16 <u>local authorities.</u>

- 18 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
