AN ACT

Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania 1 2 Consolidated Statutes, providing for gang activity. 3 The General Assembly declares that it is the right of every person, regardless of race, color, creed, religion, national 4 5 origin, sex, age, sexual orientation or handicap to be secure and protected from fear, intimidation and physical harm caused 6 7 by the activities of violent groups and individuals. It is not the intent of the General Assembly to interfere with the 8 exercise of constitutionally protected rights of freedom of 9 10 expression and association. The General Assembly recognizes the constitutional right of every citizen to harbor and express 11 12 beliefs on any lawful subject whatsoever, to lawfully associate 13 with others who share beliefs, to petition lawfully constituted 14 authority for a redress of perceived grievances and to participate in the electoral process. 15

1 The General Assembly finds that this Commonwealth is facing a mounting crisis caused by gangs whose members threaten and 2 3 terrorize peaceful citizens and commit crimes. These activities 4 both individually and collectively present a clear and present 5 danger to the public order and safety and are not constitutionally protected. 6 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 8 9 Section 1. Section 903 of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania 10 Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a subsection to read: 11 § 903. Criminal conspiracy. * * * 12 13 (h) Gang activity. -- Conspiracy shall not include gang activity as defined under section 913 (relating to gang 14 15 <u>activity).</u> 16 Section 2. Title 18 is amended by adding a section to read: 17 § 913. Gang activity. 18 (a) Offense. -- A person commits gang activity if he knowingly commits a crime for the benefit of, at the direction of or in 19 20 affiliation with a criminal gang with the intent to promote, further or assist the activities of the criminal gang. 21 22 (b) Grading.--Gang activity is a crime of the same grade and 23 degree as the most serious offense which is the object of the 24 gang activity. 25 (c) Assessment.--All persons found in violation of this 26 section shall be assessed \$300 which shall be transmitted to the 27 Criminal Gang Deterrence Fund created under subsection (g). 28 (d) Responsibilities of the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime 29 and Delinquency. -- The Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and 30 Delinquency shall award grant moneys equal to the moneys

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1	received under this section to community-based organizations
2	which implement programs to deter criminal gang activity.
3	(e) Civil cause of actionA person, organization or
4	municipality which has been coerced, intimidated, threatened or
5	otherwise harmed in violation of this act shall have a civil
6	cause of action for treble damages, an injunction, nuisance
7	abatement, asset forfeiture or any other appropriate relief in
8	law or equity. This civil action may be brought against any gang
9	member reasonably believed to have been involved in the
10	violation, including, but not limited to, gang leaders and gang
11	members who have personal knowledge of the crime. Upon
12	prevailing in this civil action based on the clear and
13	convincing evidence presented, the plaintiff may recover
14	reasonable attorney fees and costs.
15	(f) FundThere is hereby established within the State
16	Treasury a separate nonlapsing revolving account to be known as
17	the Criminal Gang Deterrence Fund. The fund shall be
18	administered by the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and
19	Delinquency for the purpose of developing, implementing and
20	administrating a program of award grants to community
21	organizations which implement programs to deter criminal gang
22	activity.
23	(g) DefinitionsAs used in this section, the following
24	words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
25	subsection:
26	"Criminal gang."
27	(1) A combination, confederation, alliance, network,
28	conspiracy, in law or fact, of three or more persons that do
29	either of the following:
30	(i) Engages in a pattern of criminal activity
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1	through its membership or through the agency of any
2	member and at the direction, order, solicitation or
3	request of a conspirator who is a leader, officer,
4	director, organizer or other governing or policymaking
5	person in the conspiracy, or at the direction, order,
б	solicitation or request of such person's agent, deputy or
7	representative.
8	(ii) Engages in a pattern of criminal activity
9	through its membership or through the agency of any
10	member.
11	(2) Any evidence reasonably tending to show or
12	demonstrate, in law or in fact, the existence of or
13	membership in any conspiracy, confederation or other
14	association described herein, or probative of the existence
15	of or membership in any such association, shall be admissible
16	in any action or proceeding brought under this section.
17	"Criminal gang member." A person who demonstrates
18	affiliation with a criminal gang by any two or more of the
19	following indicia:
20	(1) An admission of gang membership.
21	(2) Identification as a gang member by a parent,
22	<u>guardian, spouse or sibling.</u>
23	(3) Identification by an informant, verified by
24	independent information.
25	(4) More than one arrest while in the company of
26	identified gang members for any criminal offense.
27	(5) Identification as a gang member by physical evidence
28	such as photographs or other documentation.
29	"Pattern of criminal activity." Two or more felonies,
30	misdemeanors or a combination thereof committed on separate

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- 1 occasions within a three-year period.
- 2 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 90 days.
