AN ACT

Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 2 Statutes, further providing for subsequent convictions of driving while operating privilege is suspended or revoked. 3 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 5 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Section 6503 of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania 6 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read: 7 8 § 6503. Subsequent convictions of certain offenses. 9 (a) General rule. -- Every person convicted of a second or 10 subsequent violation of any of the following provisions shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than \$200 nor more than 11 12 \$1,000 or to imprisonment for not more than six months, or both: Section 1501(a) (relating to drivers required to be 13 14 licensed). 15 [Section 1543 (relating to driving while operating privilege is suspended or revoked).] 16 Section 3367 (relating to racing on highways). 17

- 9 fine of not less than \$200 nor more than \$1,000 and to
- 10 imprisonment for a minimum of 90 days but not more than six
- 11 months.
- 12 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
