A RESOLUTION

1 Memorializing Congress to investigate the admissions policies of
2 hospitals of the Department of Veterans' Affairs.

3 WHEREAS, Certain concerns have arisen relating to the
4 admissions policies of VA hospitals; and

5 WHEREAS, There have been numerous complaints that
6 constituents are being turned away from VA hospitals for various
7 reasons, among them that there are not enough beds or the
8 hospitals are short-staffed; and

9 WHEREAS, There are reports that, upon careful review, there
10 are seemingly ample empty beds; therefore be it

11 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the
12 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania memorialize the Congress of the
13 United States to give this situation careful review and fully
14 investigate the admissions practices of VA hospitals; and be it
15 further

16 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to
17 the presiding officers of each house of Congress and to each

1 member of Congress from Pennsylvania.
