A RESOLUTION

- 1 Providing for a task force to investigate certain pricing
 2 practices.
- 3 WHEREAS, Price gouging of products during times of market
- 4 disruption may create unconscionably high prices for consumers
- 5 and excessive profits for producers; and
- 6 WHEREAS, When a market is influenced by military action,
- 7 embargoes or extreme weather conditions, producers periodically
- 8 charge excessive prices for products; and
- 9 WHEREAS, "Essential safeguards" for the public must be
- 10 assured to protect the citizens of this Commonwealth; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Price gouging exists if there is a gross disparity
- 12 between the price of the product immediately before and
- 13 immediately after a market emergency and if that disparity is
- 14 not substantially attributable to additional costs imposed to
- 15 suppliers; therefore be it

- 1 RESOLVED, That a task force be created to present its
- 2 findings and any recommended legislation to the House of
- 3 Representatives; and be it further
- 4 RESOLVED, That the task force be comprised of the Governor,
- 5 the Attorney General, the Chairman and the Minority Chairman of
- 6 the Business and Economic Development Committee, the Chairman
- 7 and the Minority Chairman of the Consumer Affairs Committee of
- 8 the House of Representatives or the respective task force
- 9 member's designated appointee; and be it further
- 10 RESOLVED, That the task force shall prepare a final report
- 11 for presentation to the House of Representatives by January 1,
- 12 1996.
